



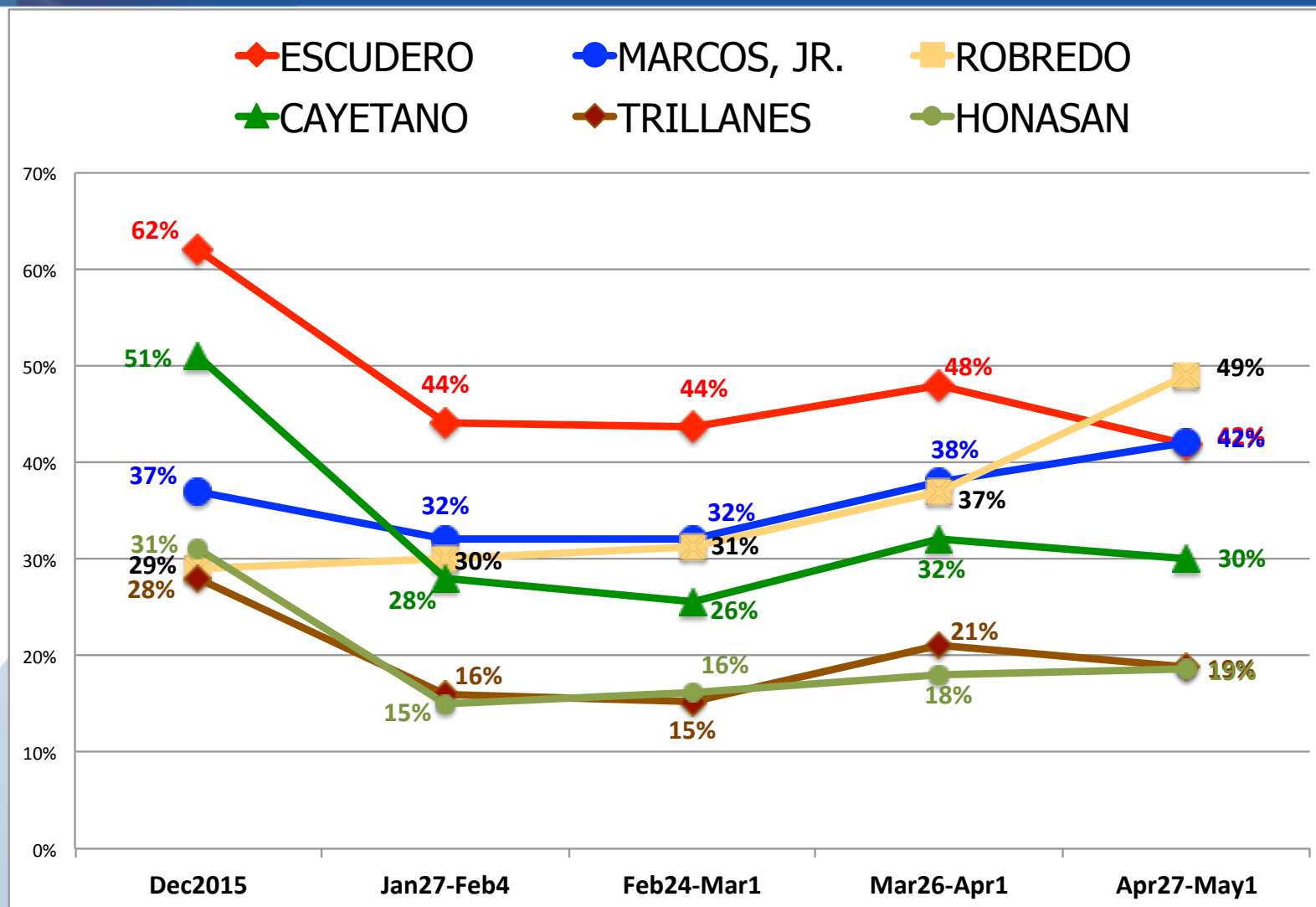

Trust Ratings of Vice Presidentialiables

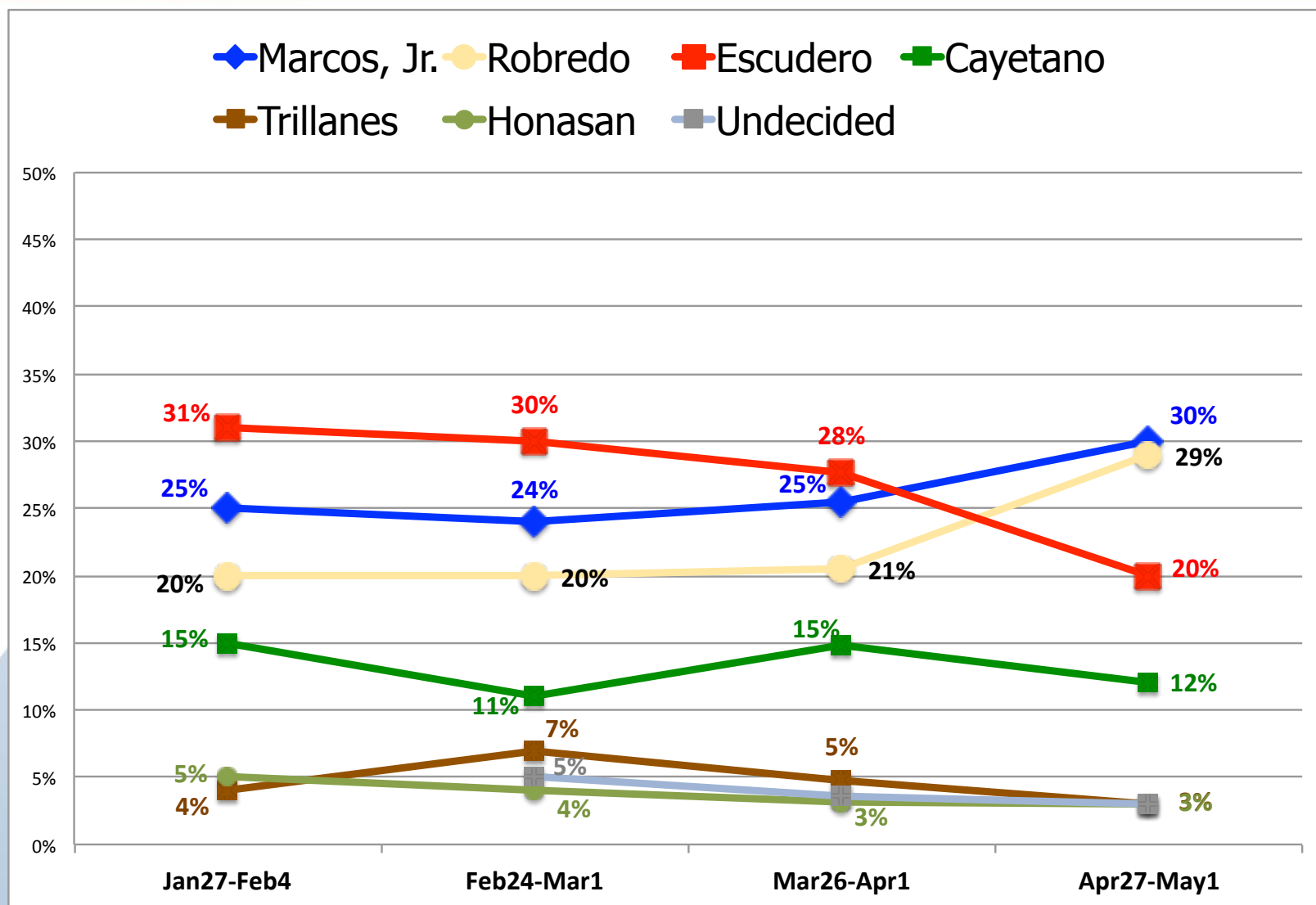

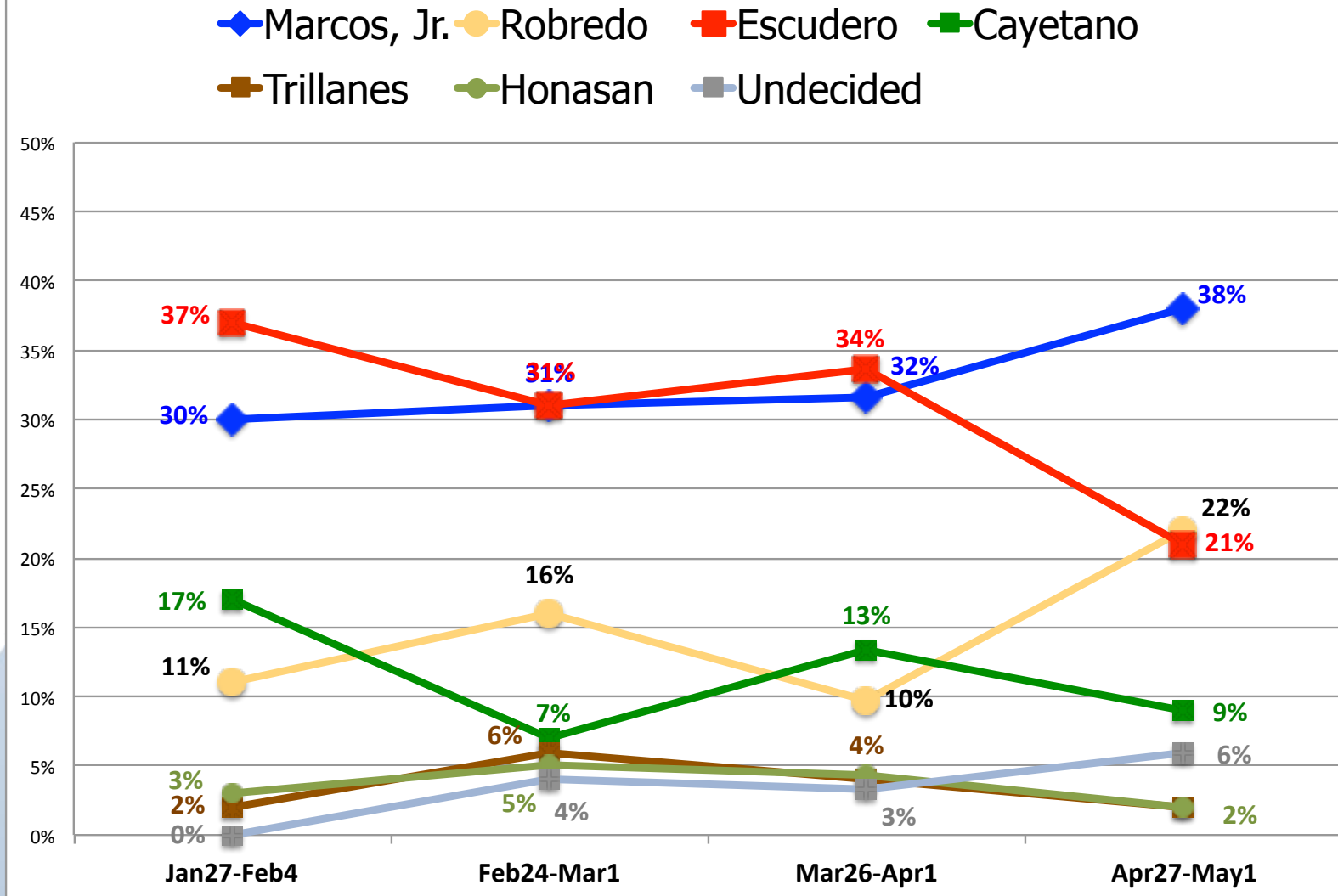

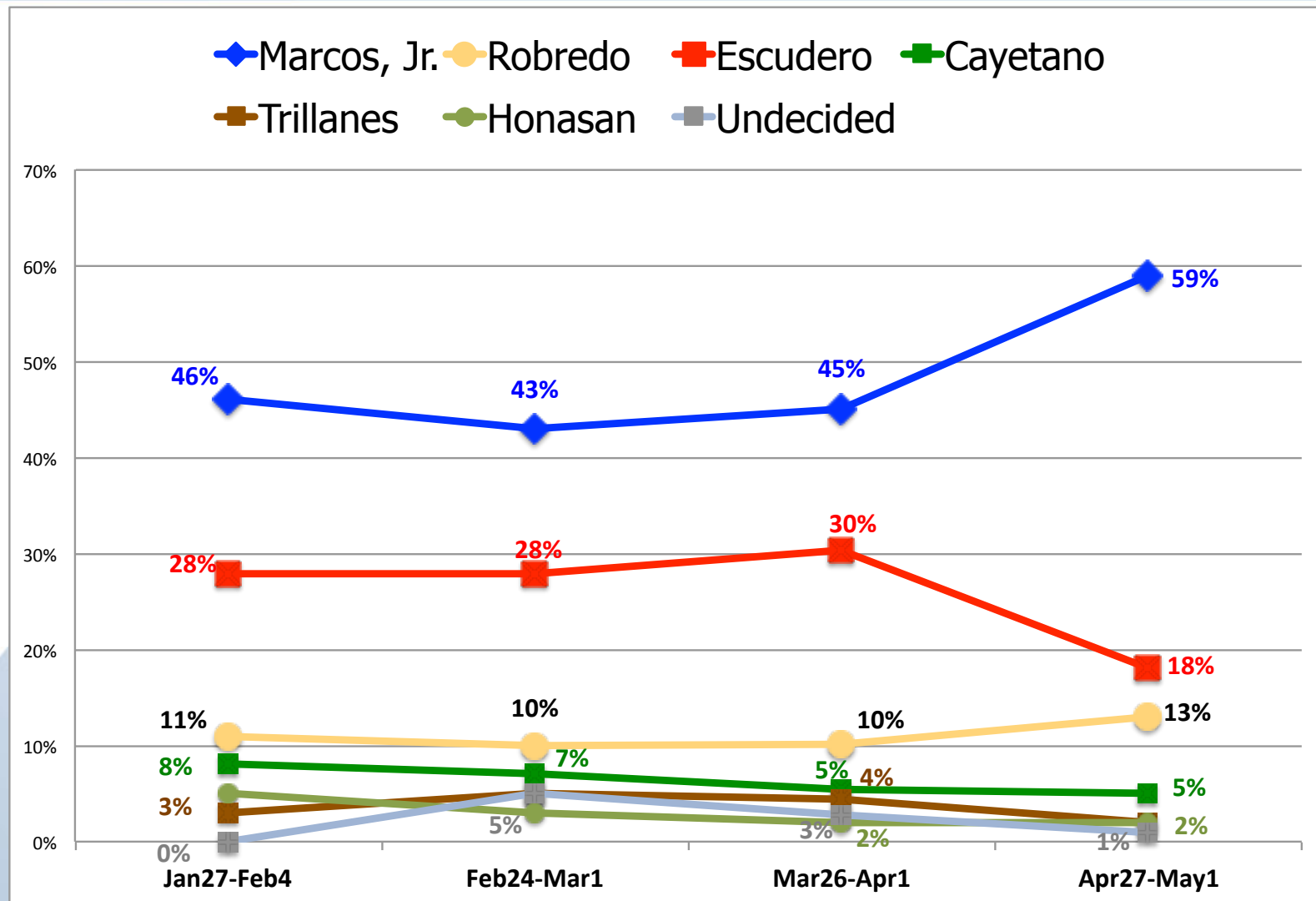

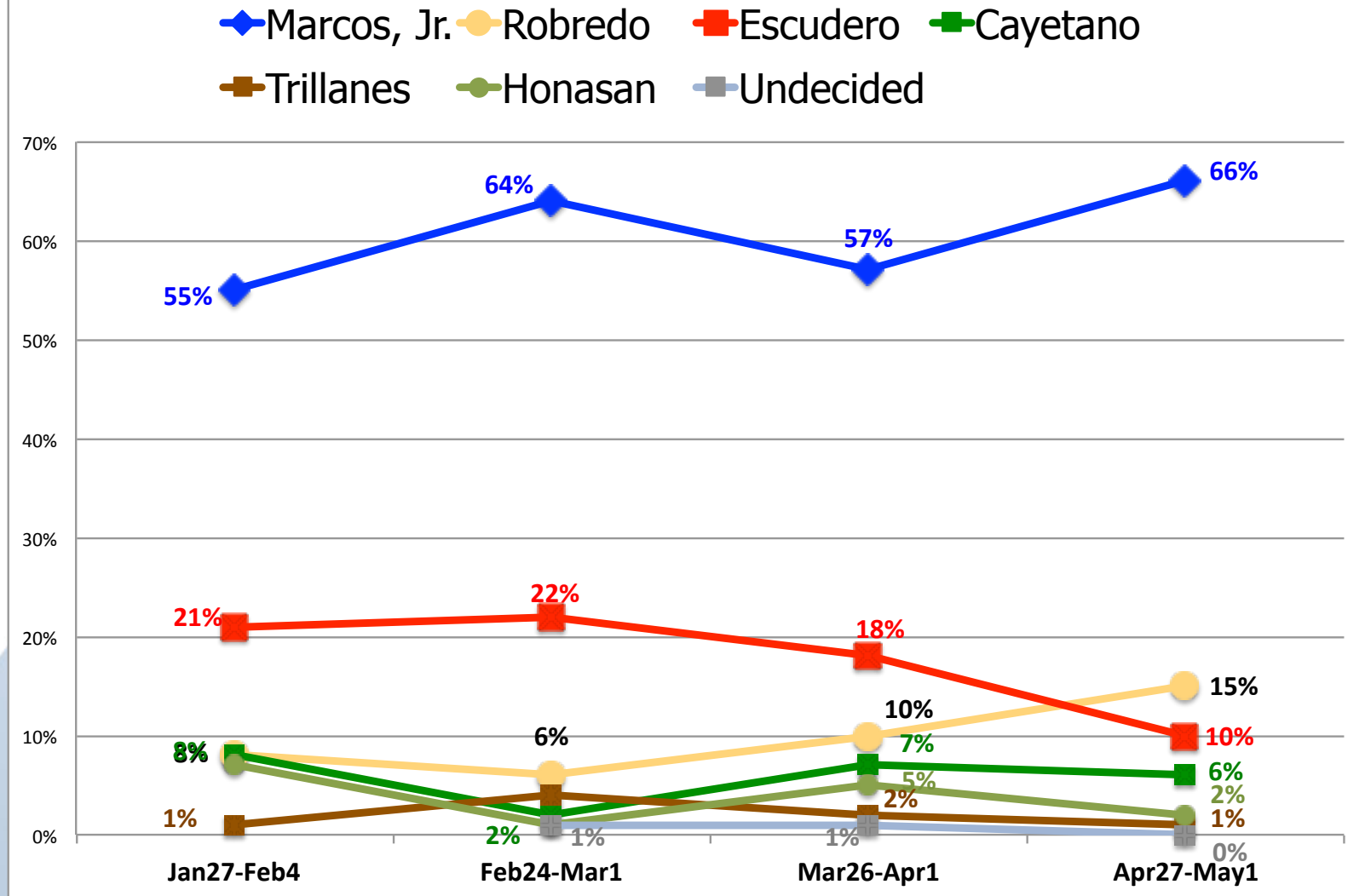

Voter Preference for Vice President: CORDILLERA



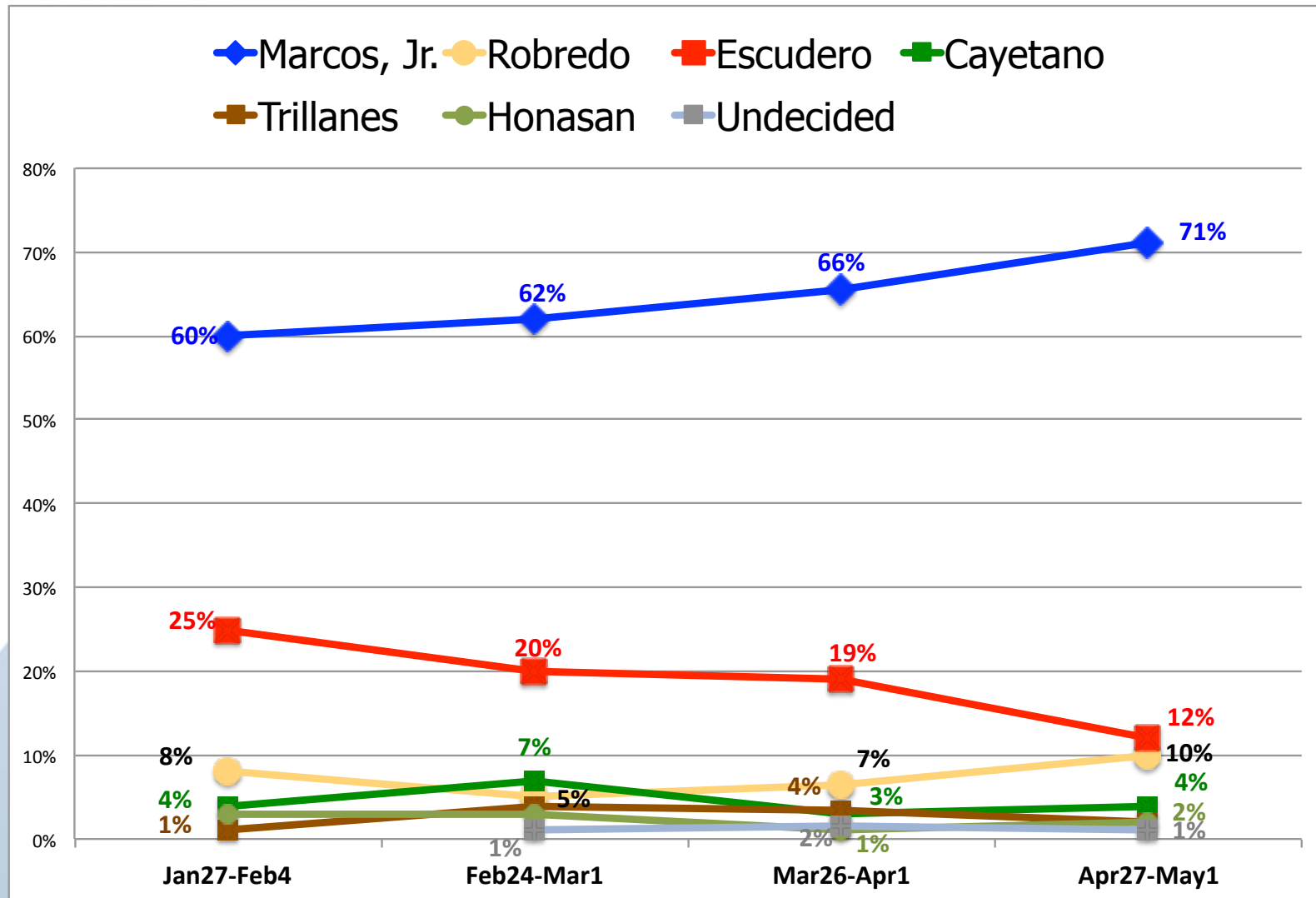

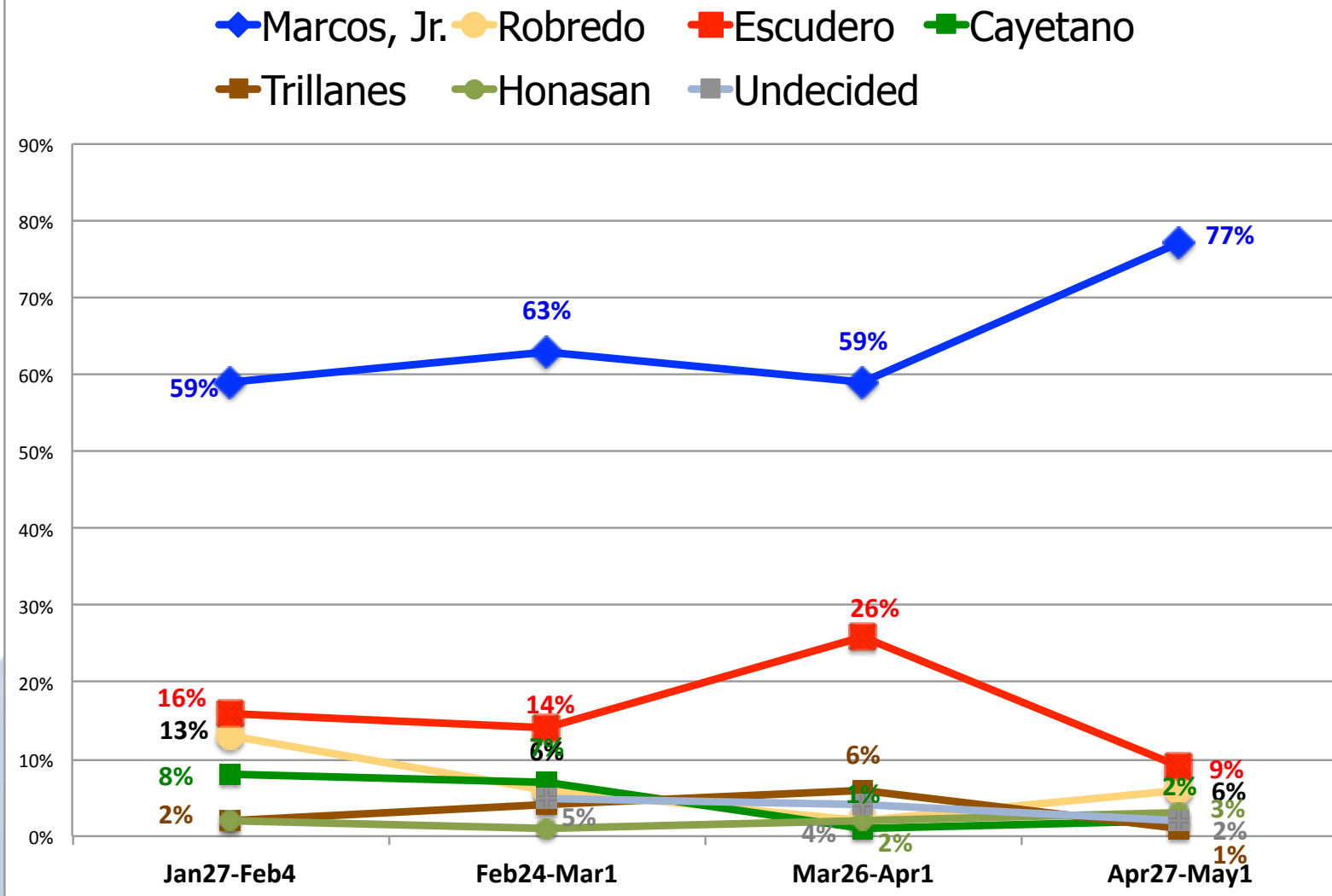

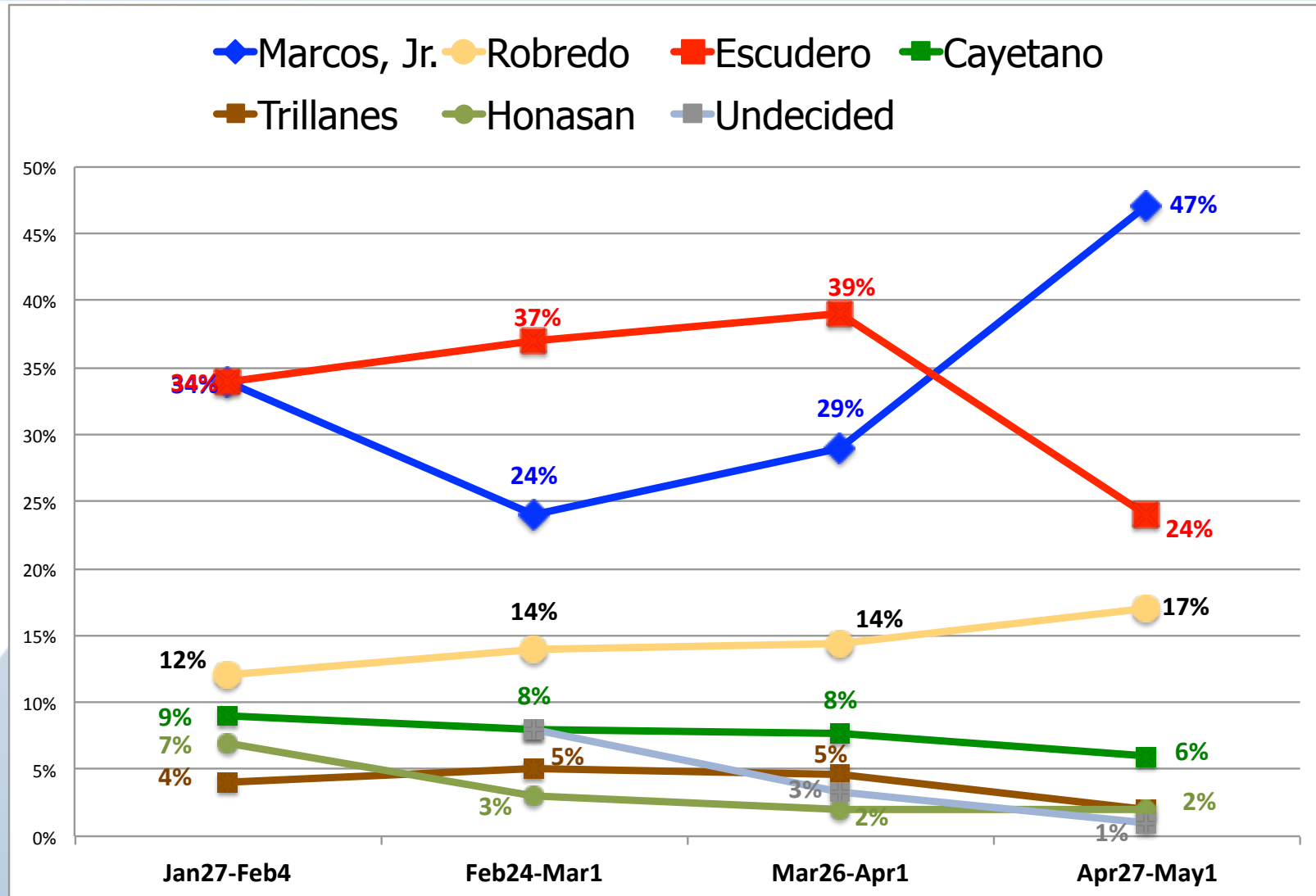

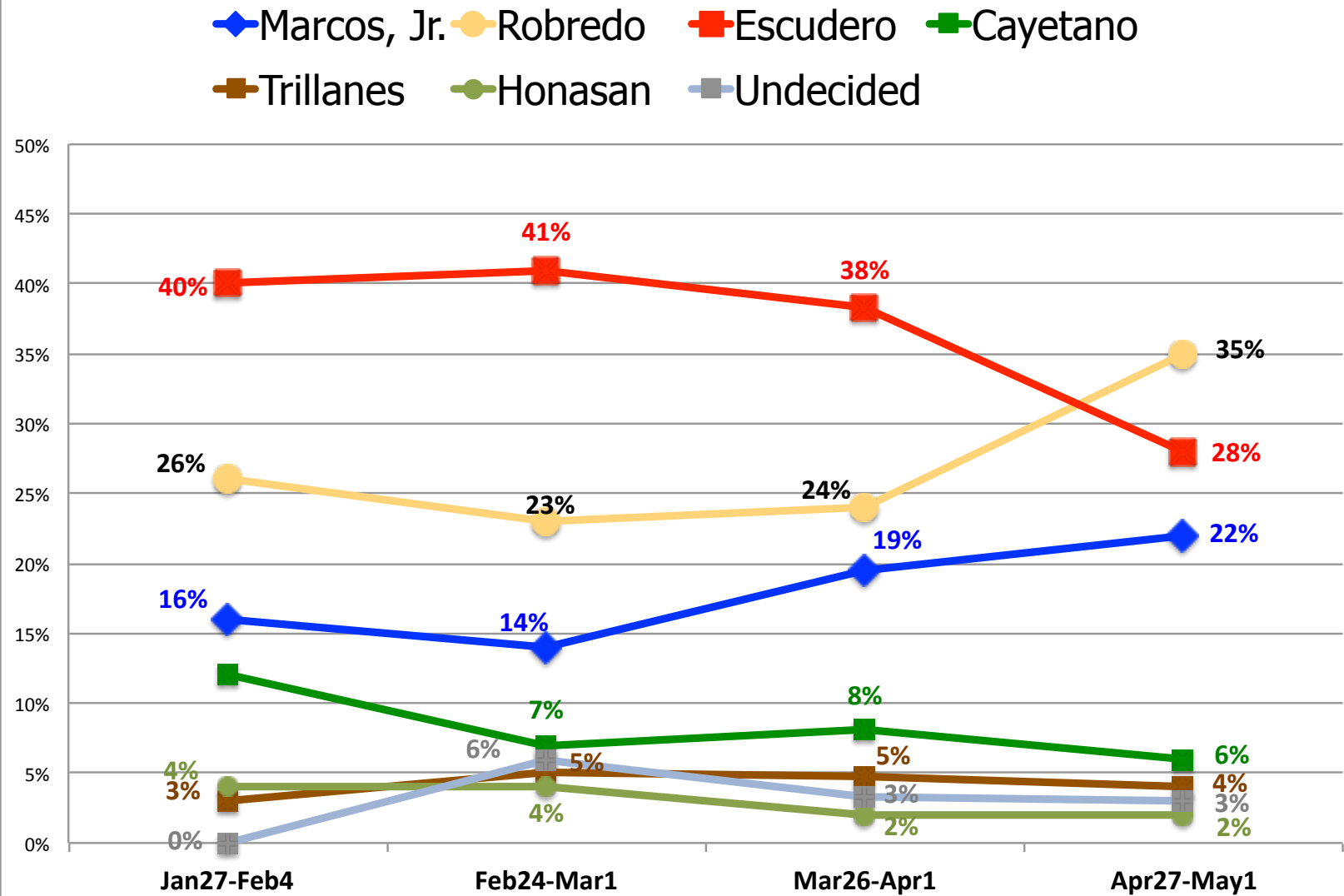

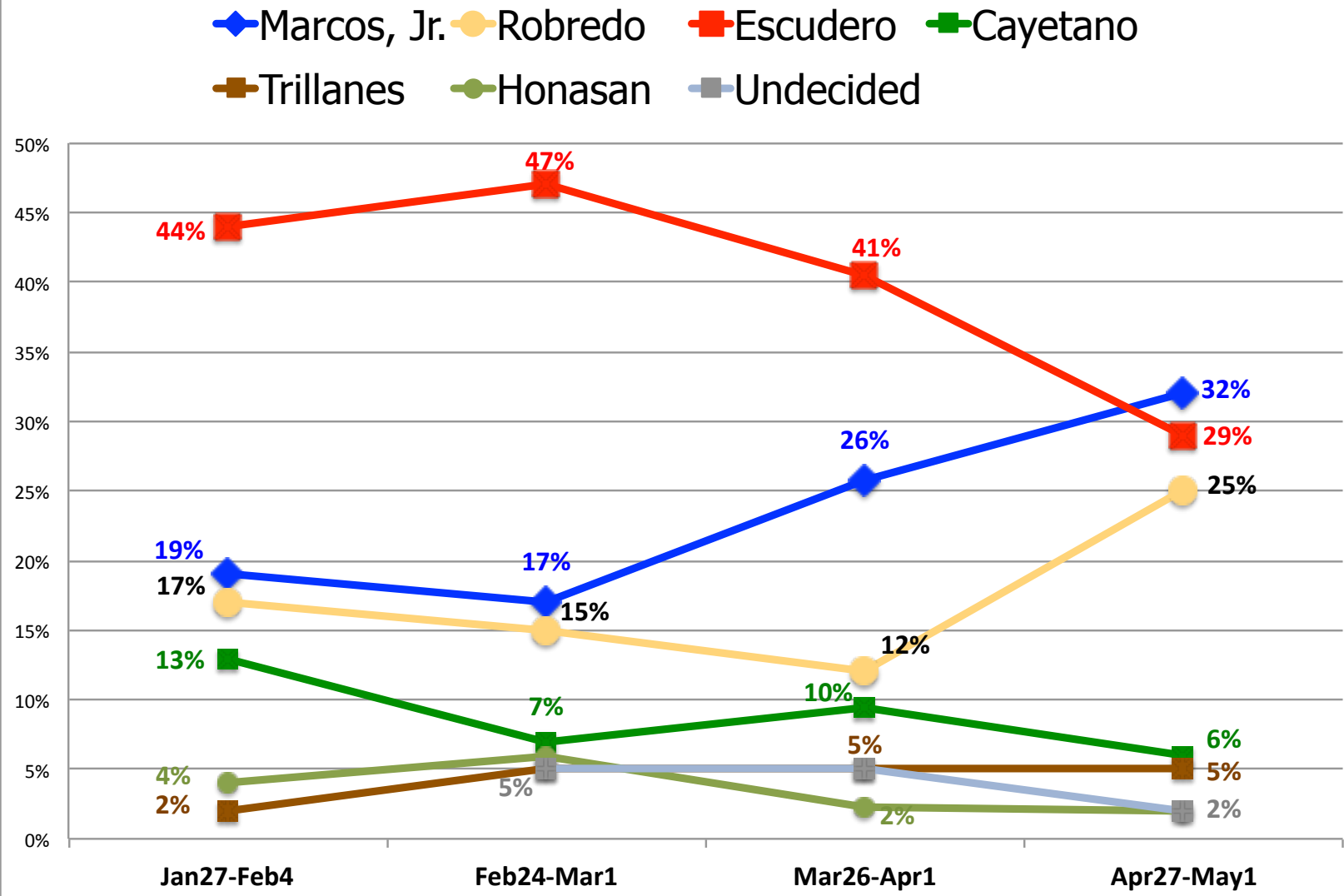

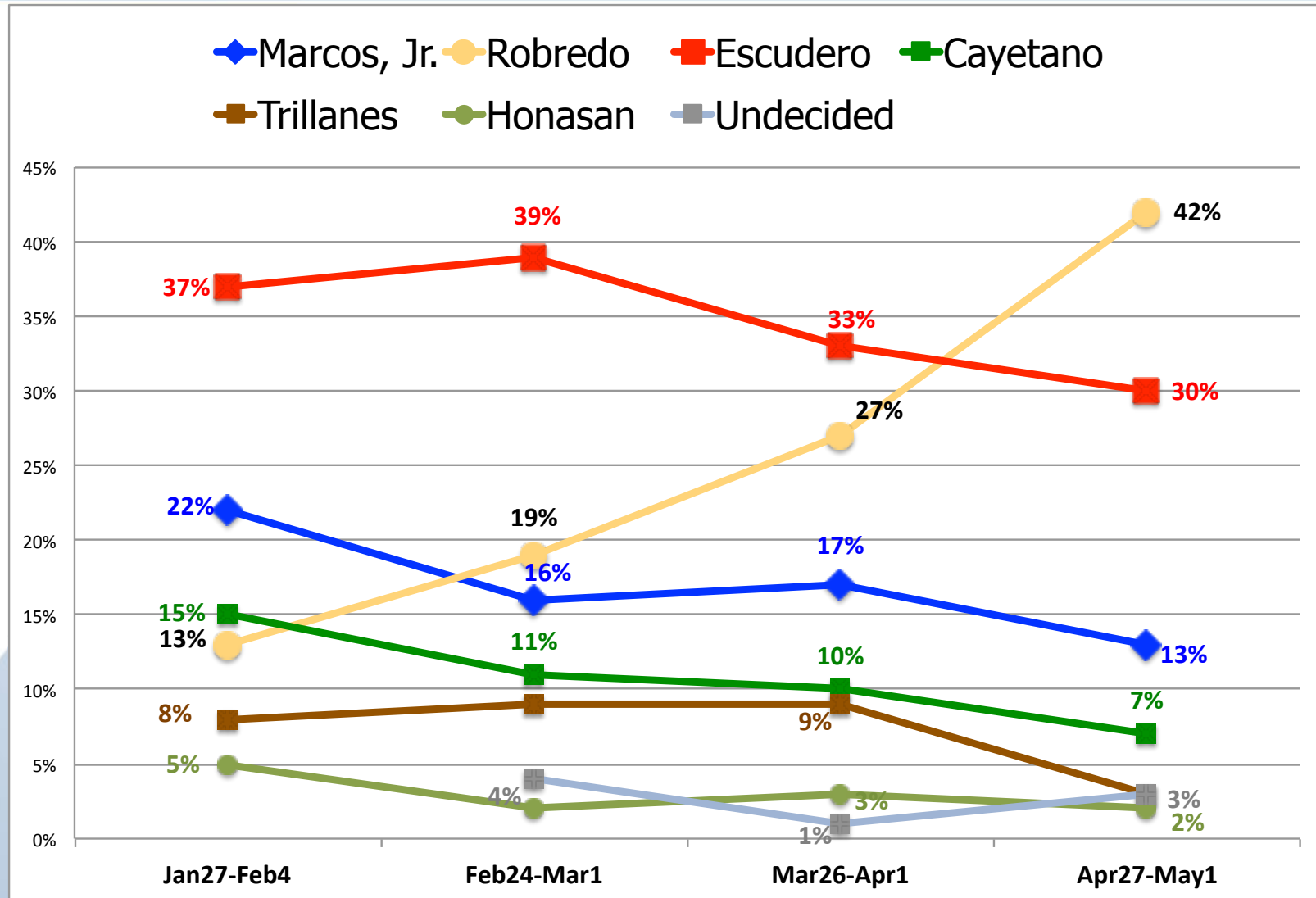

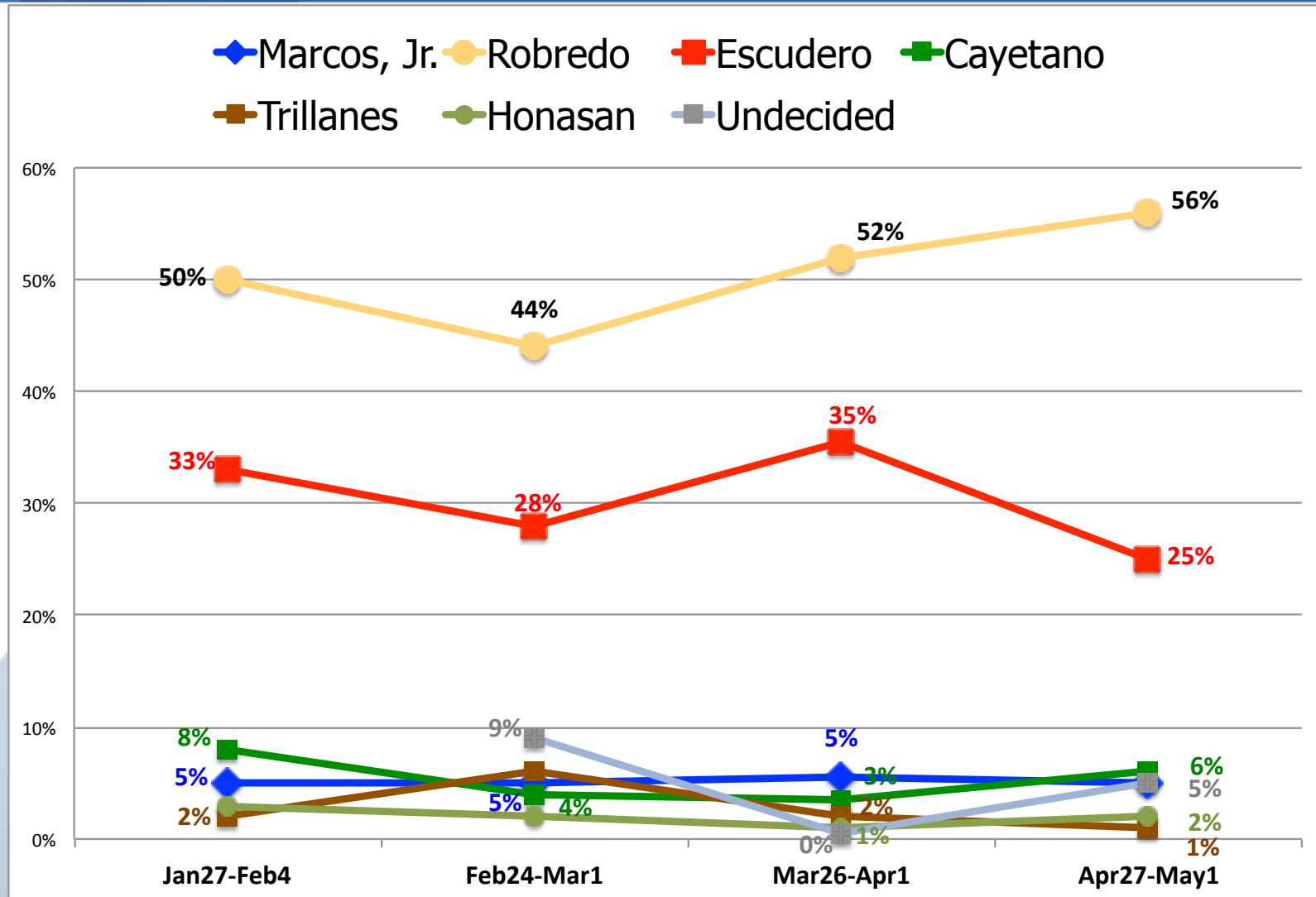

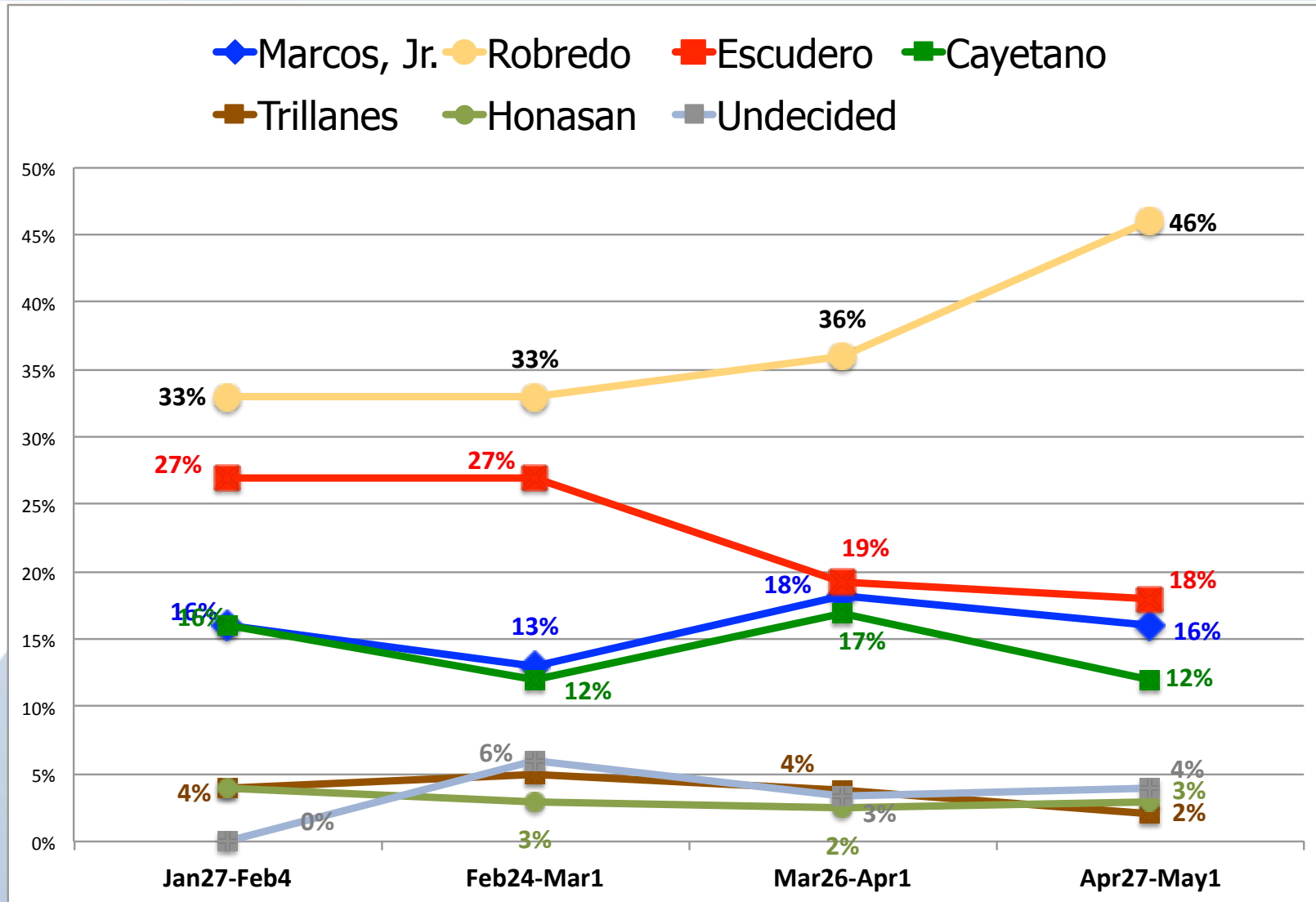

Voter Preference for Vice President: VISAYAS



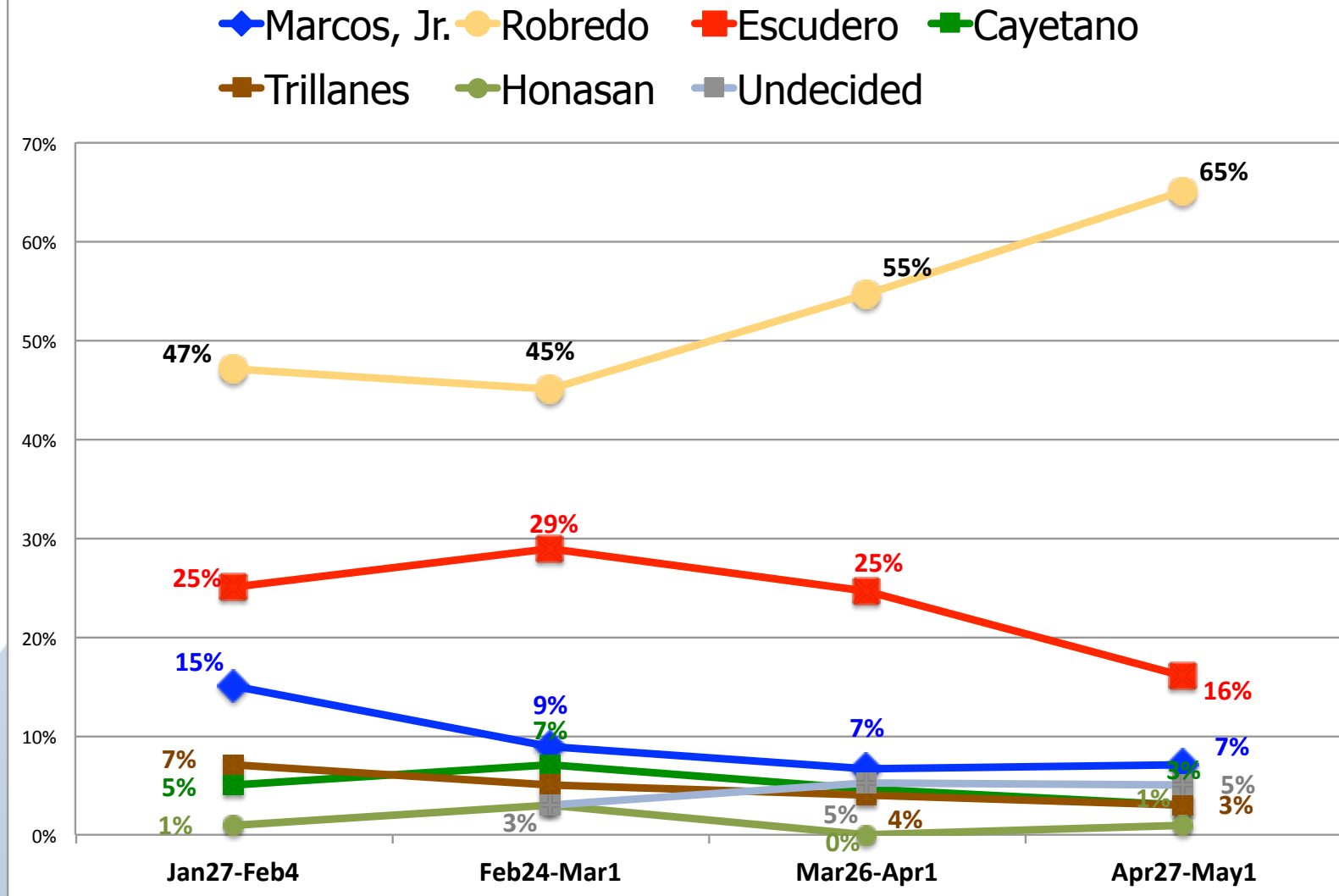

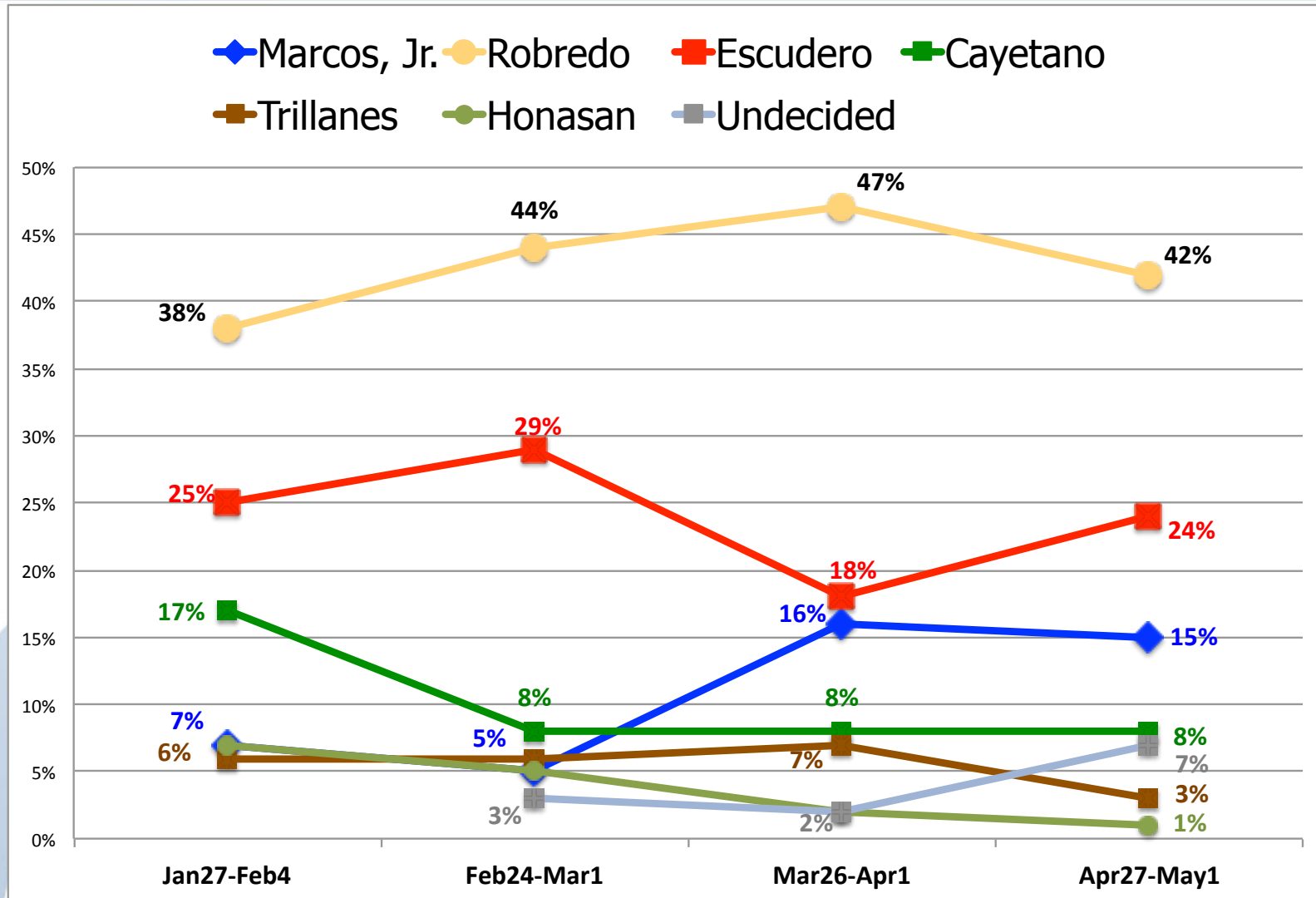

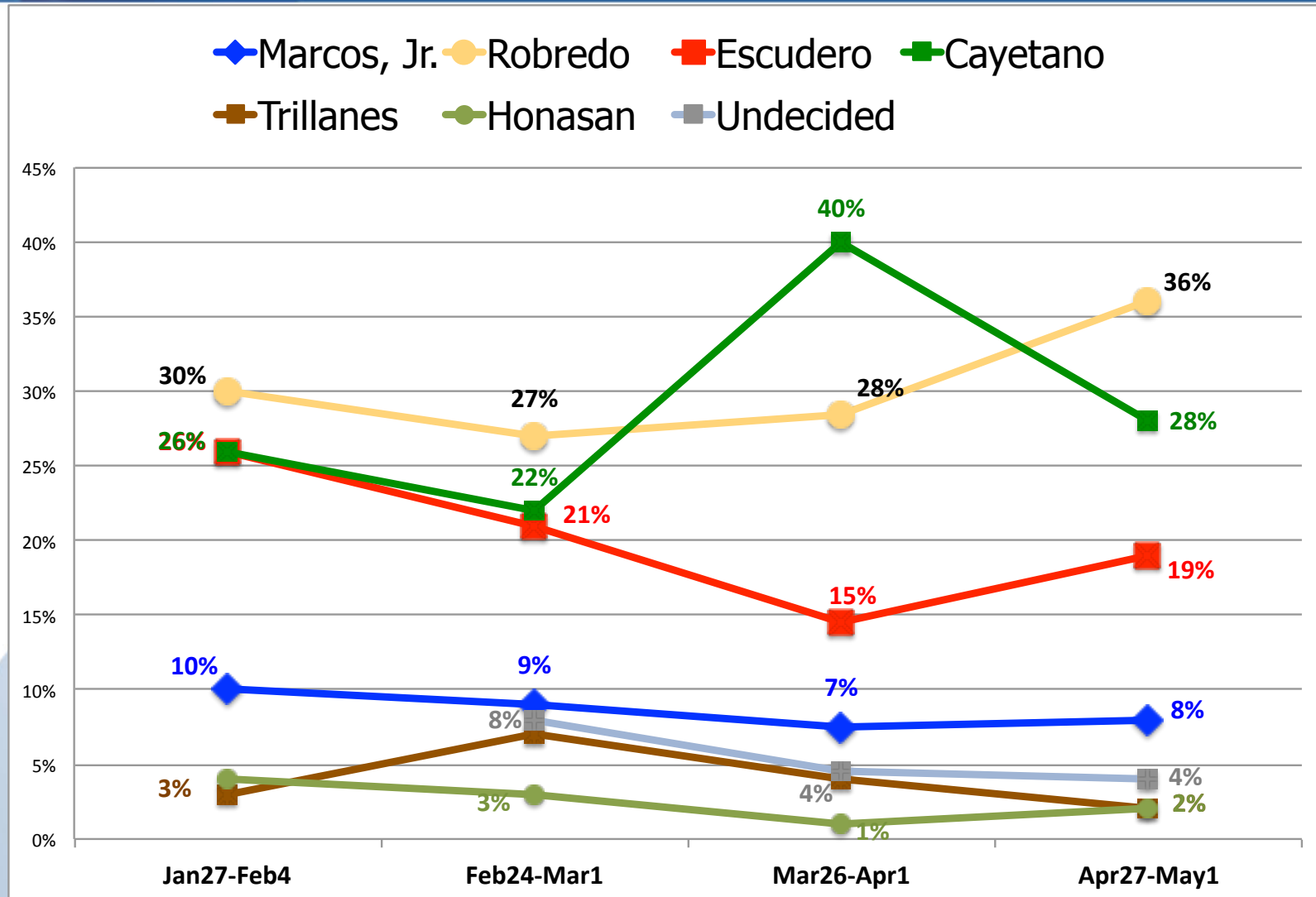

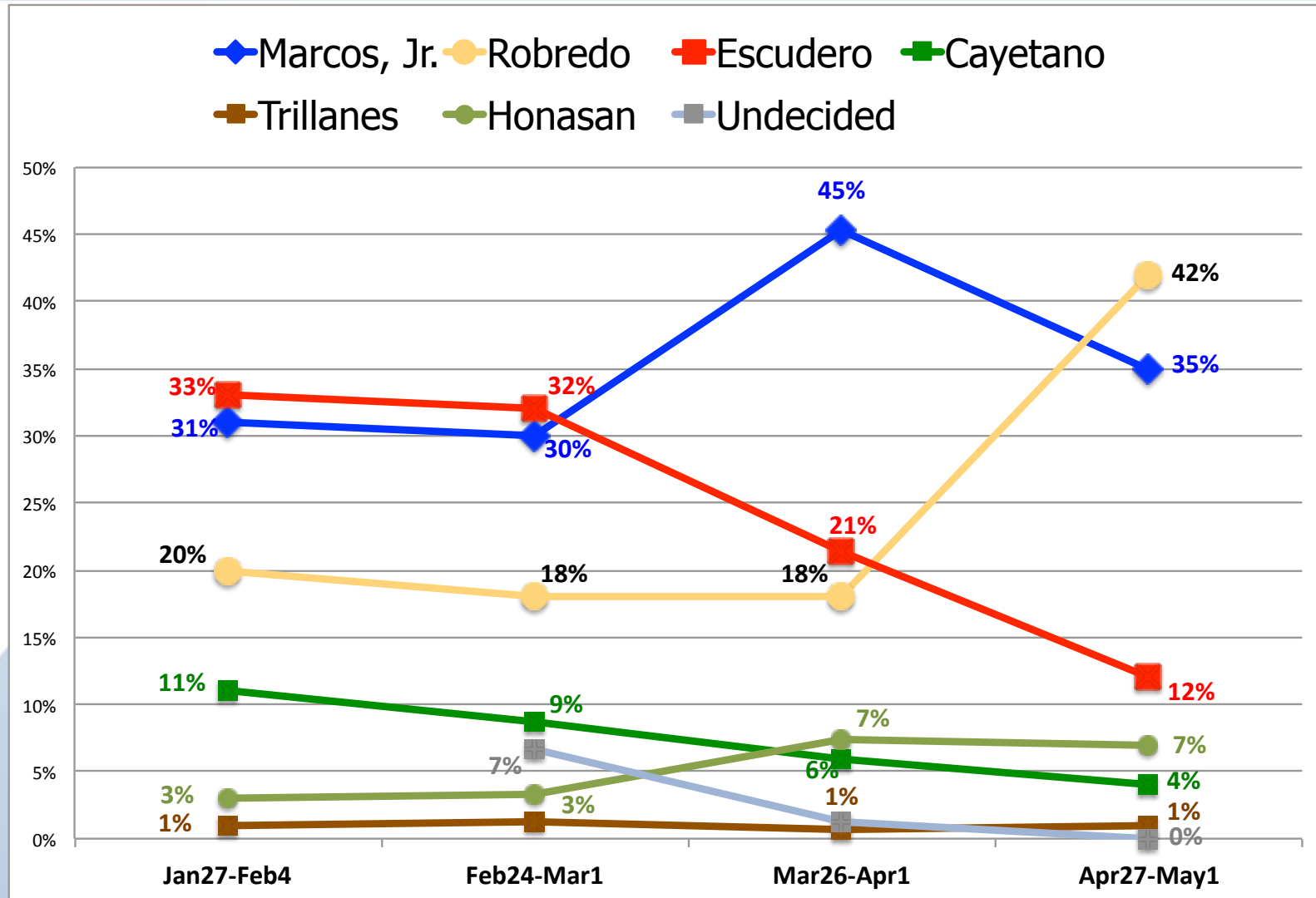

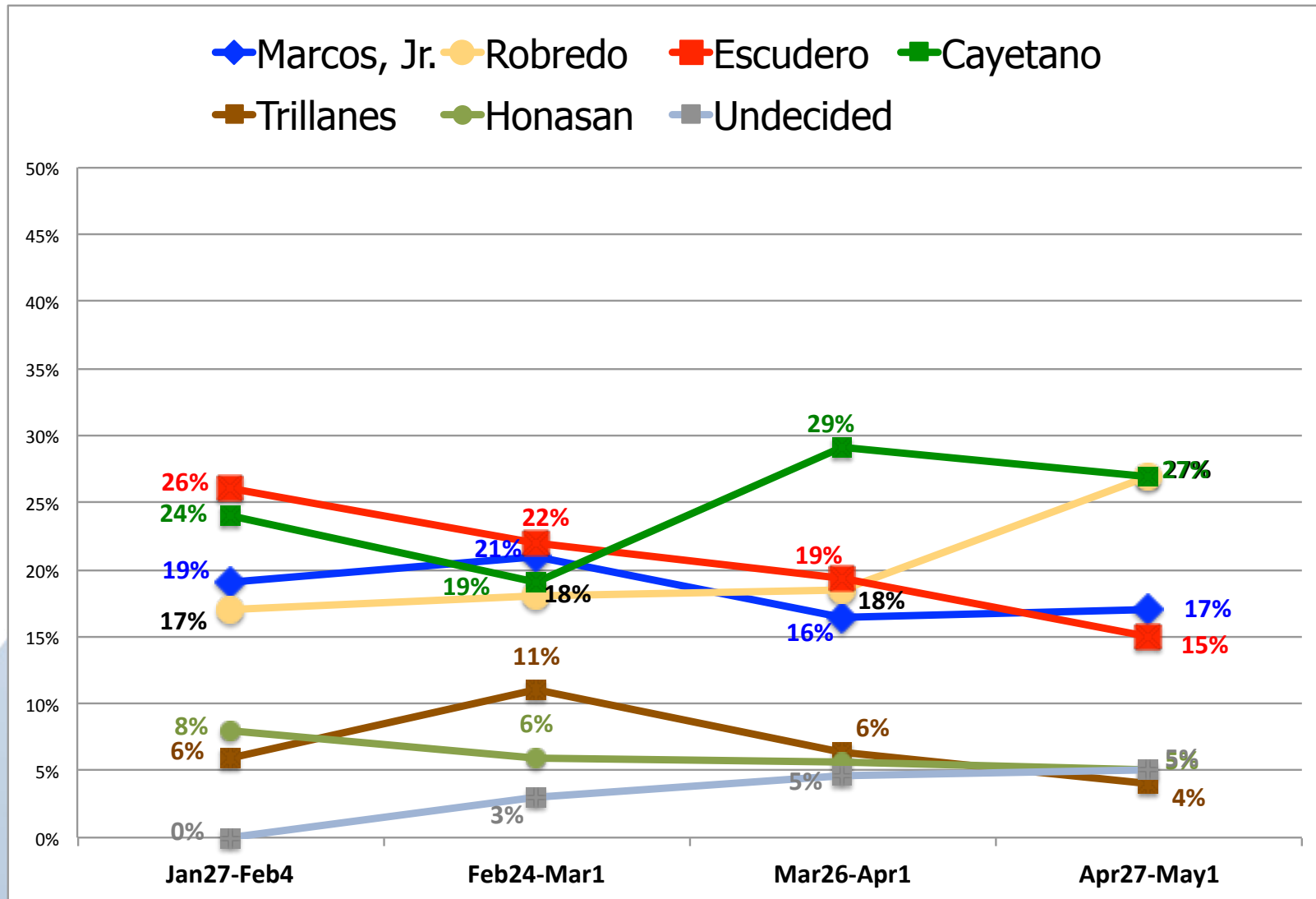

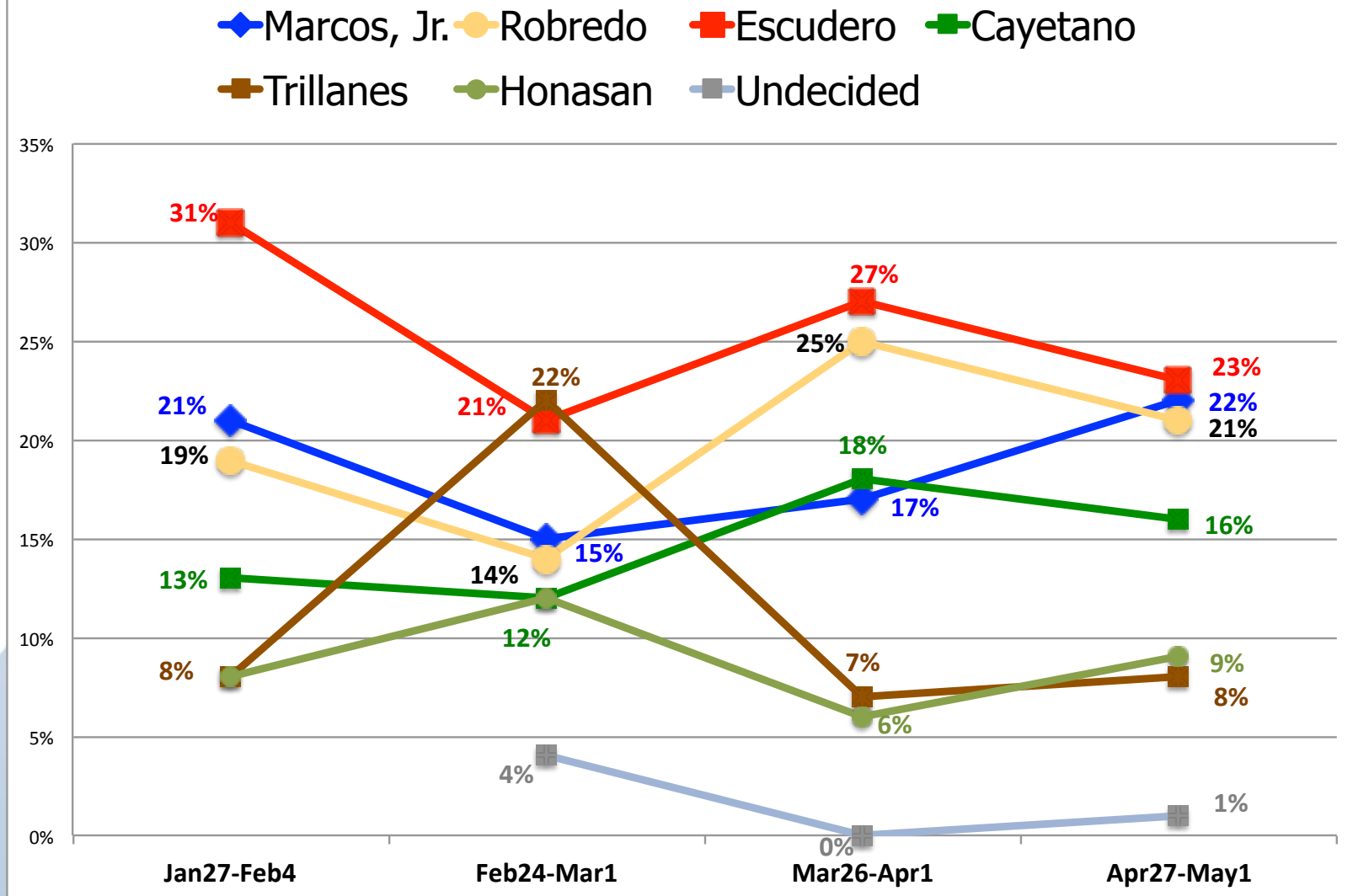

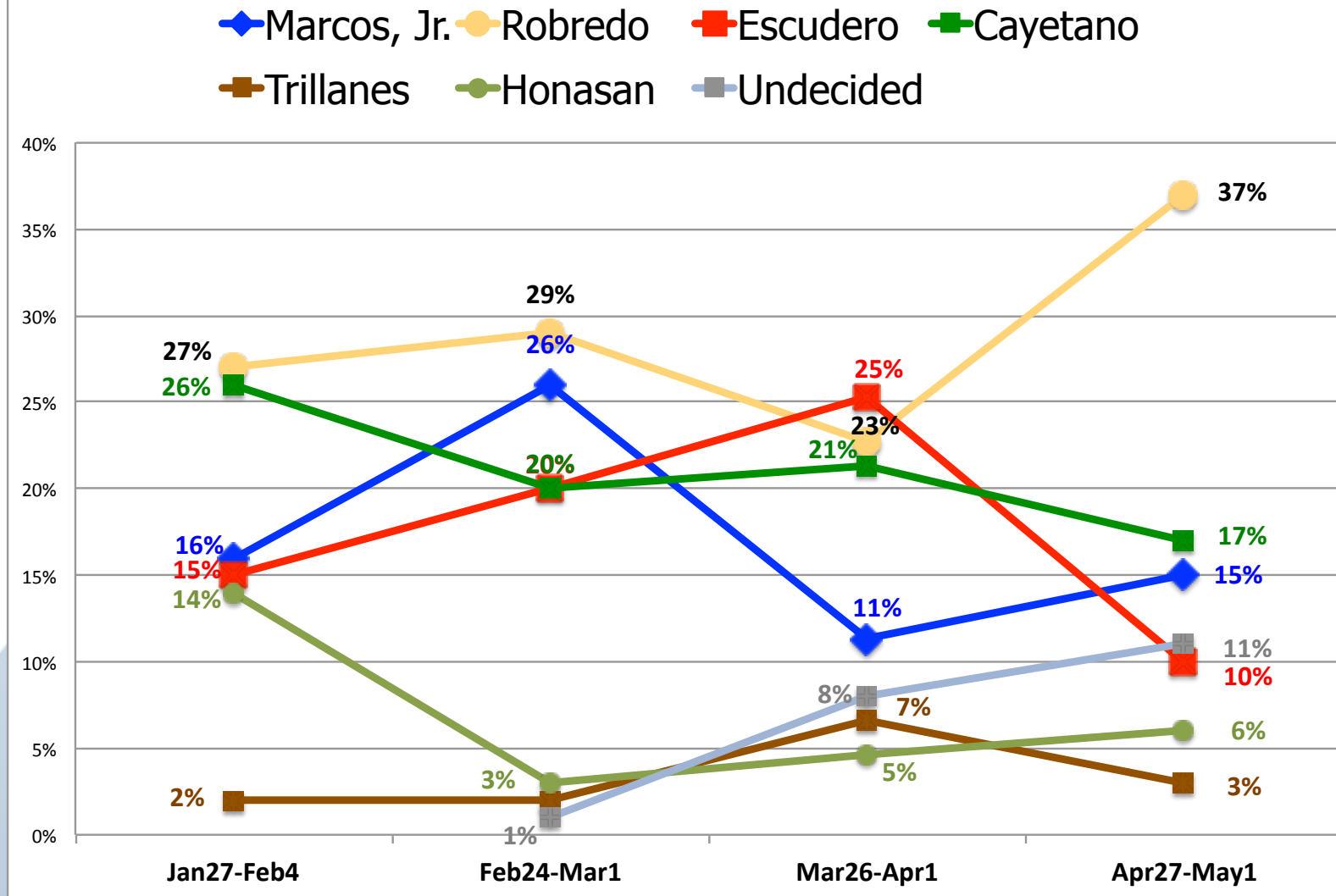

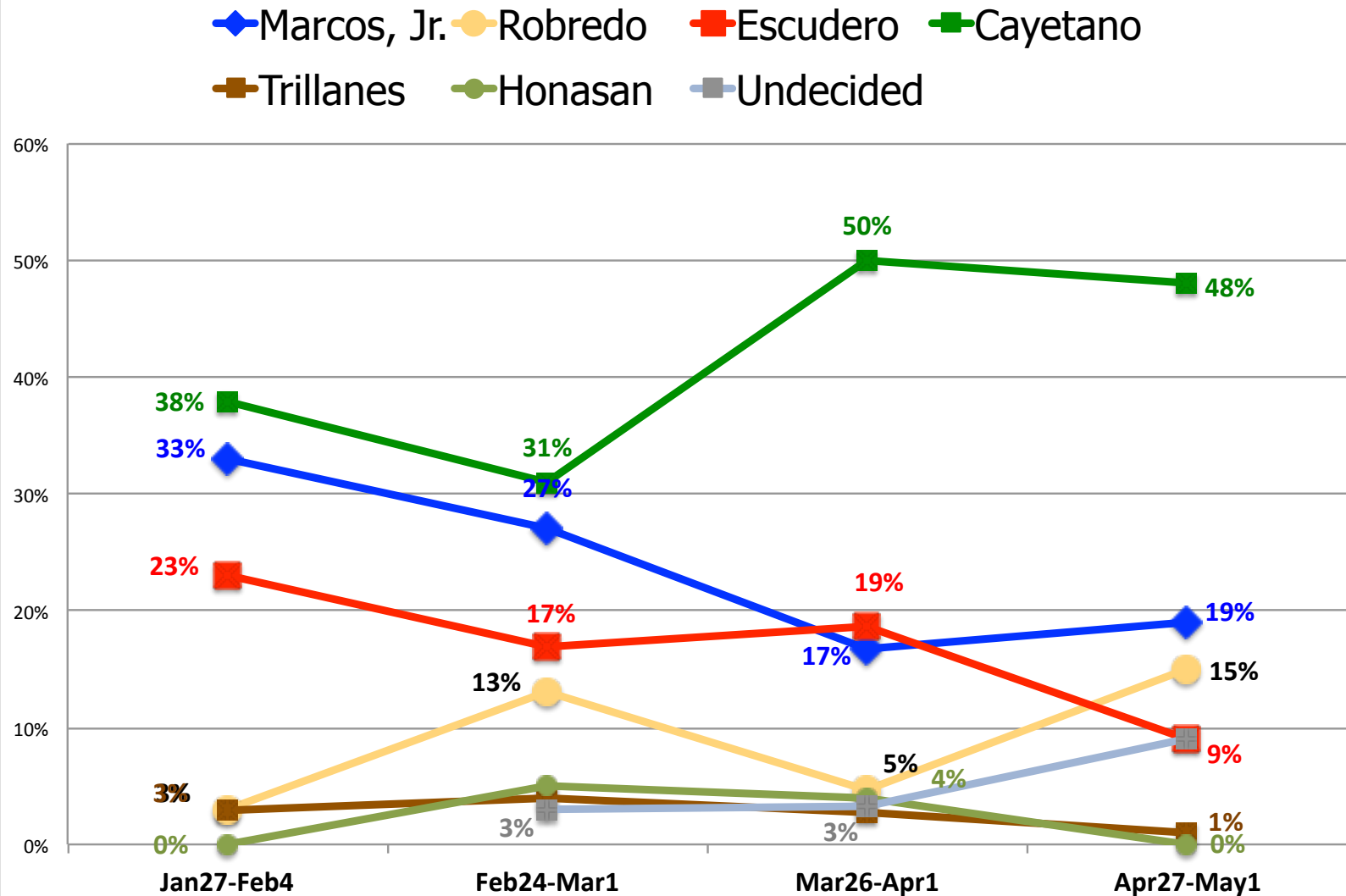

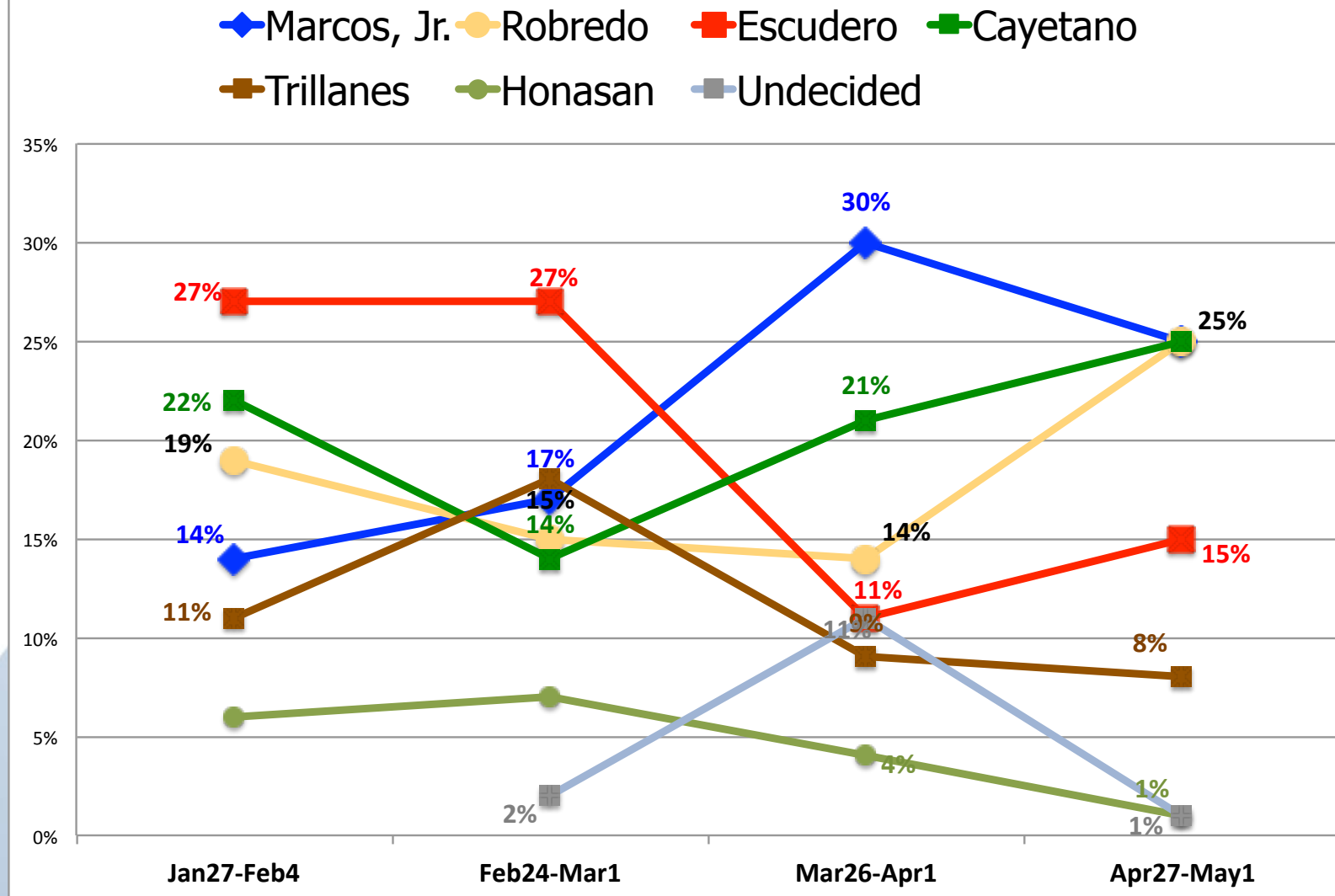

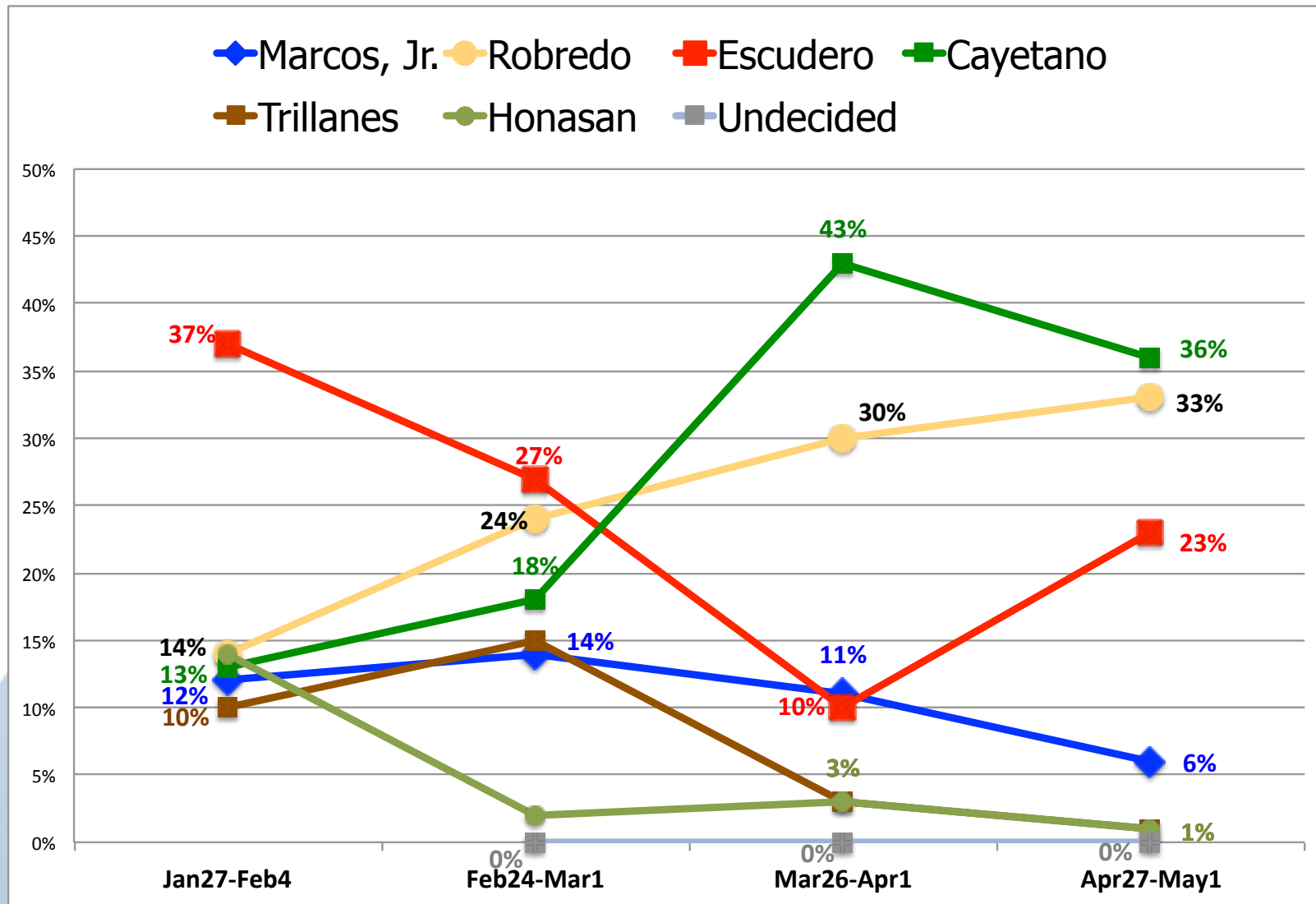

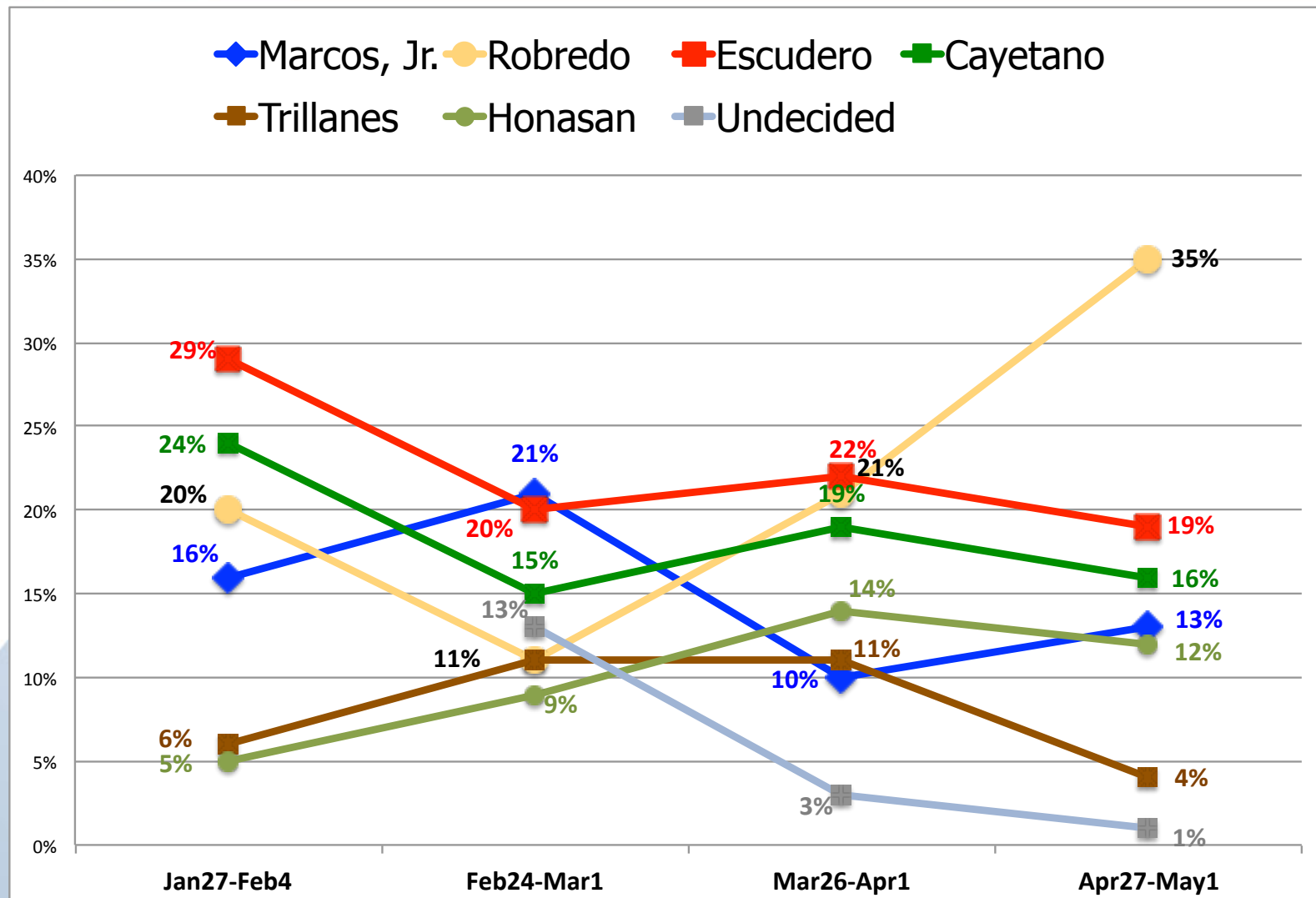

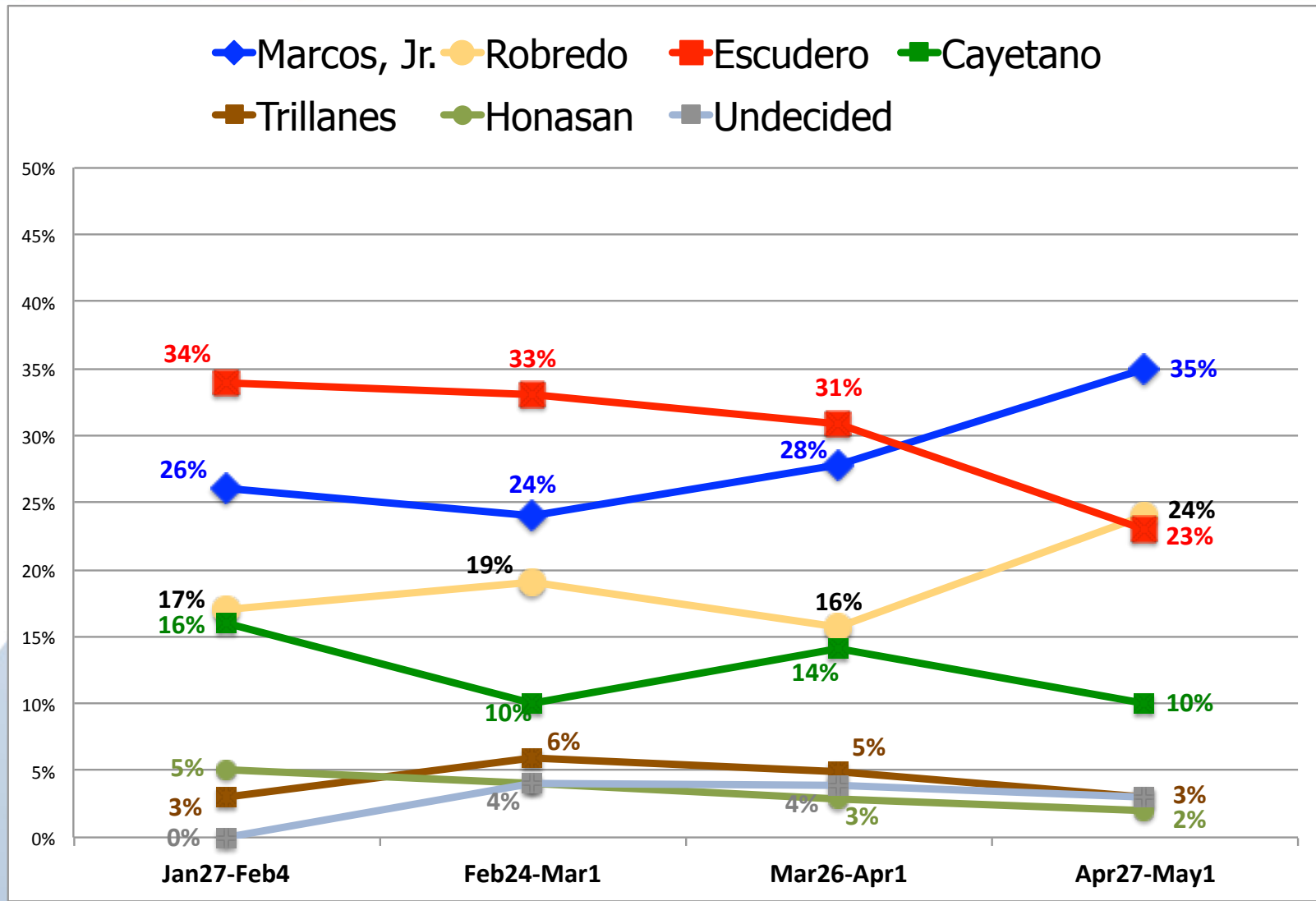

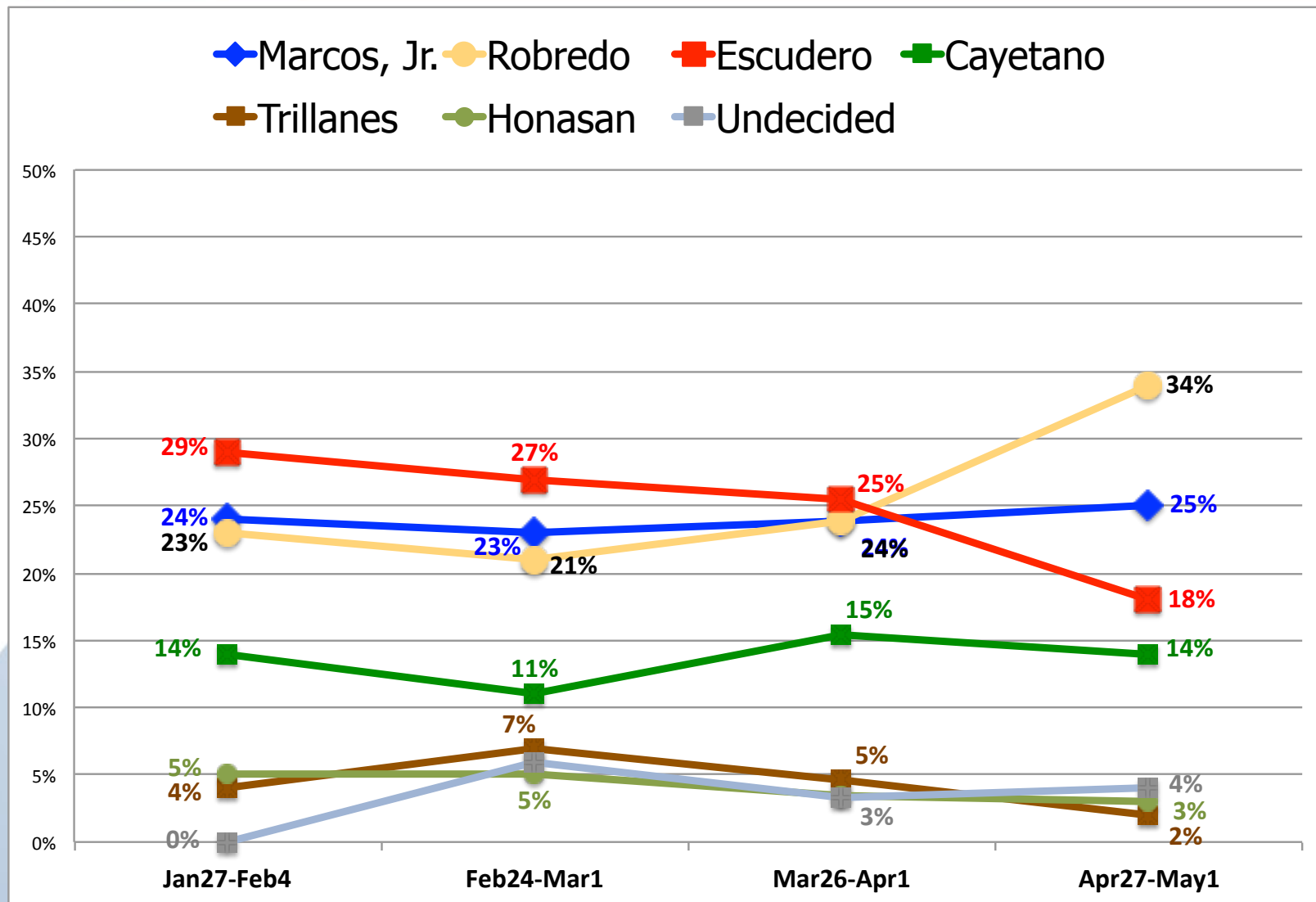

Voter Preference for Vice President: Urban



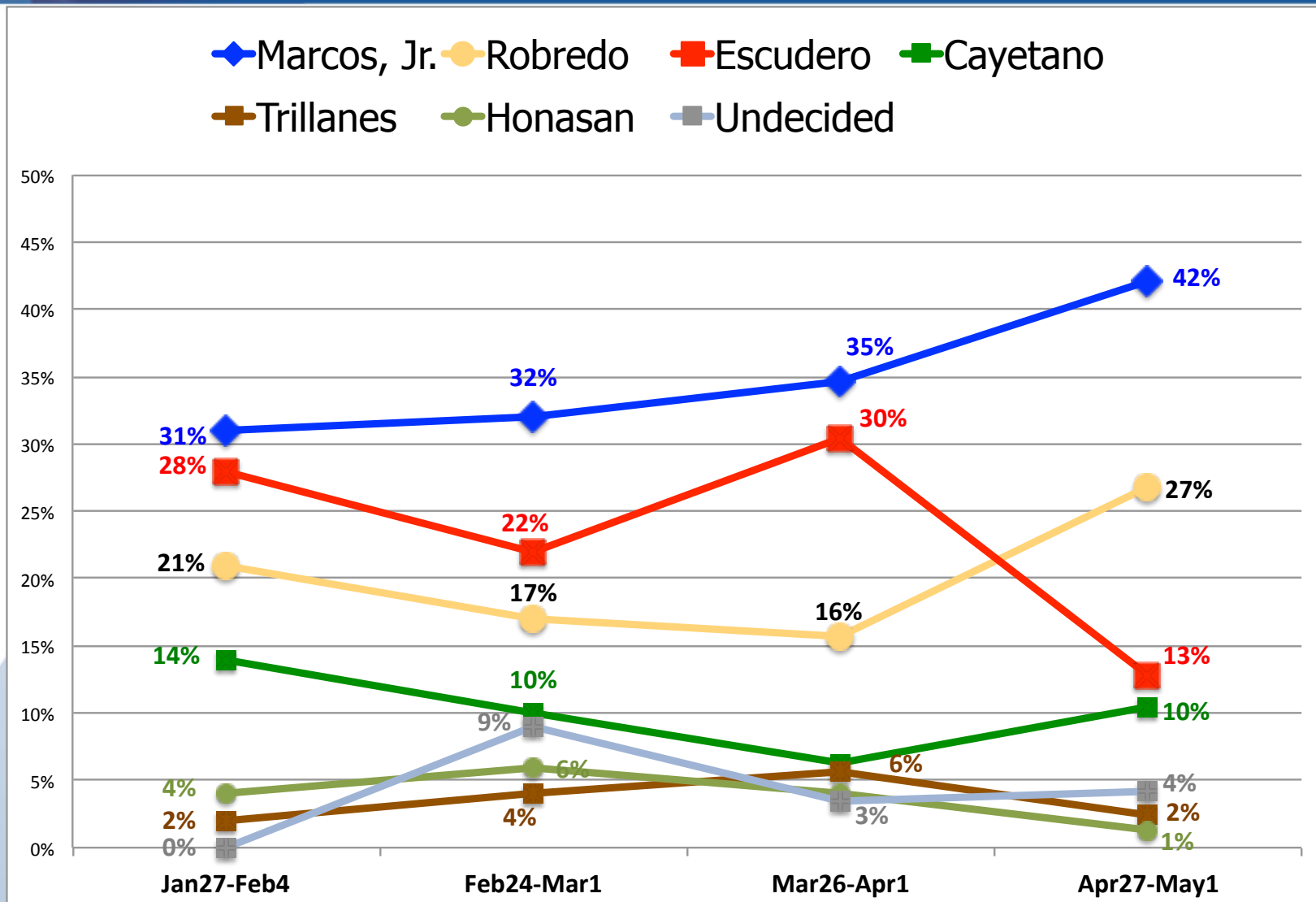

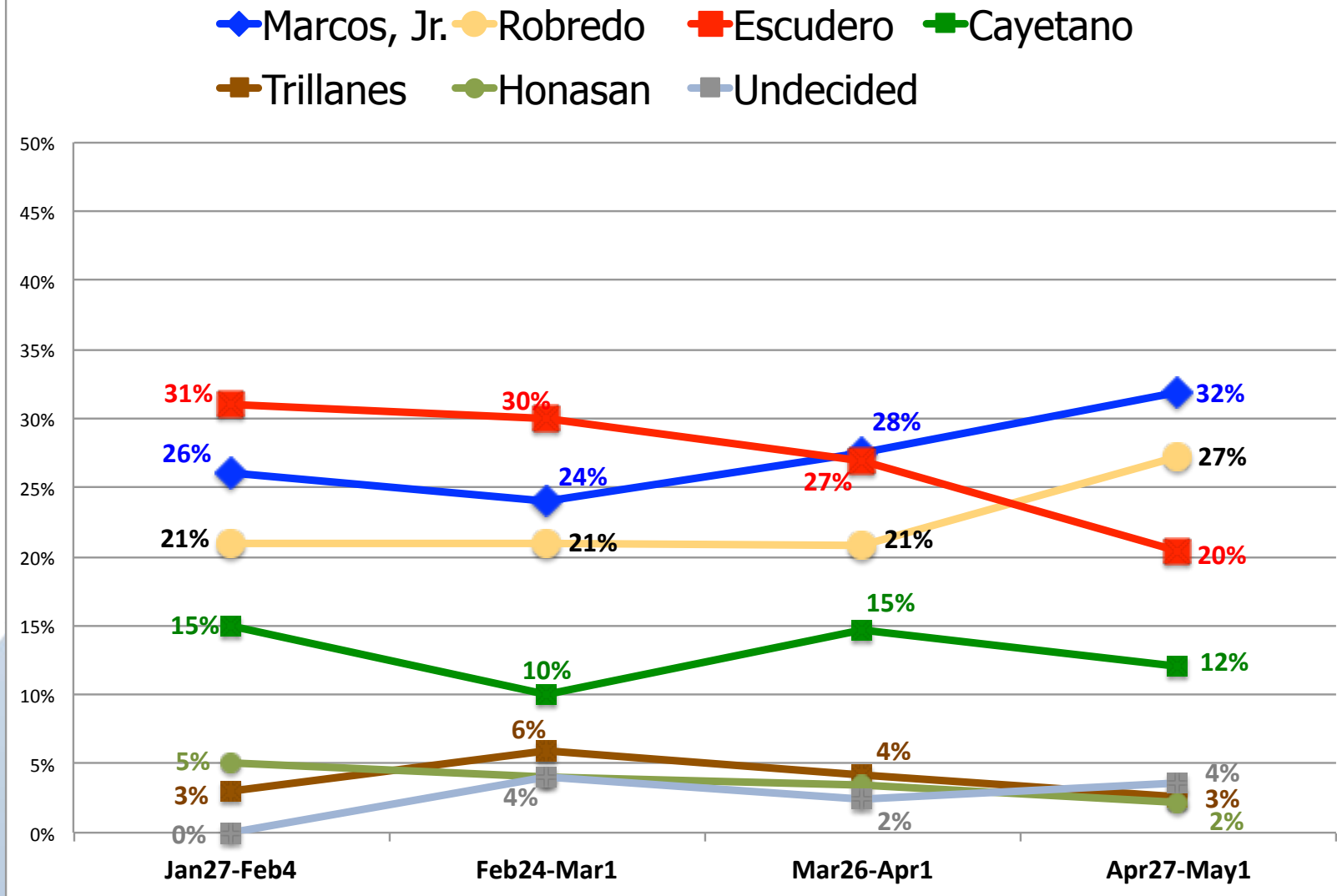

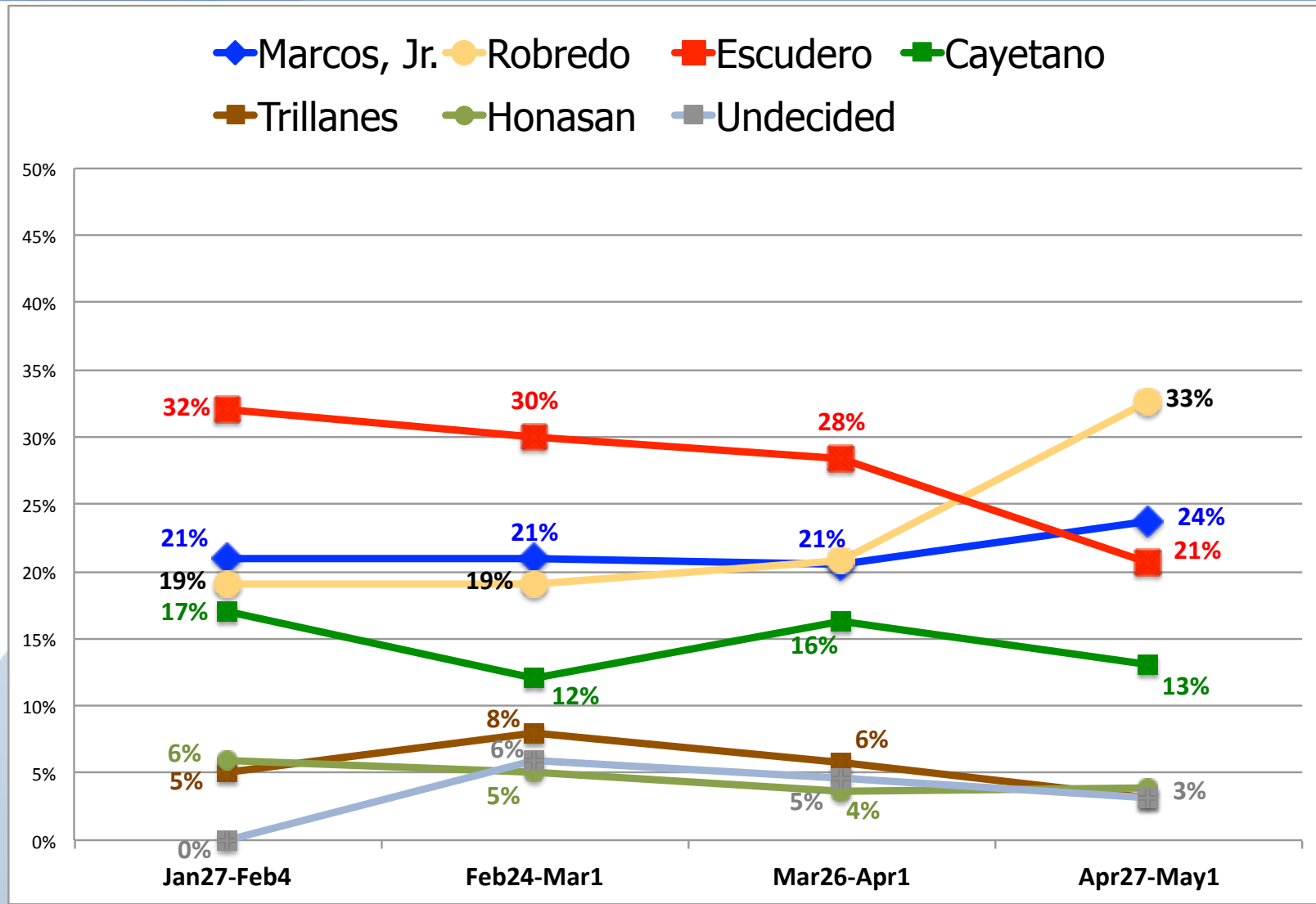

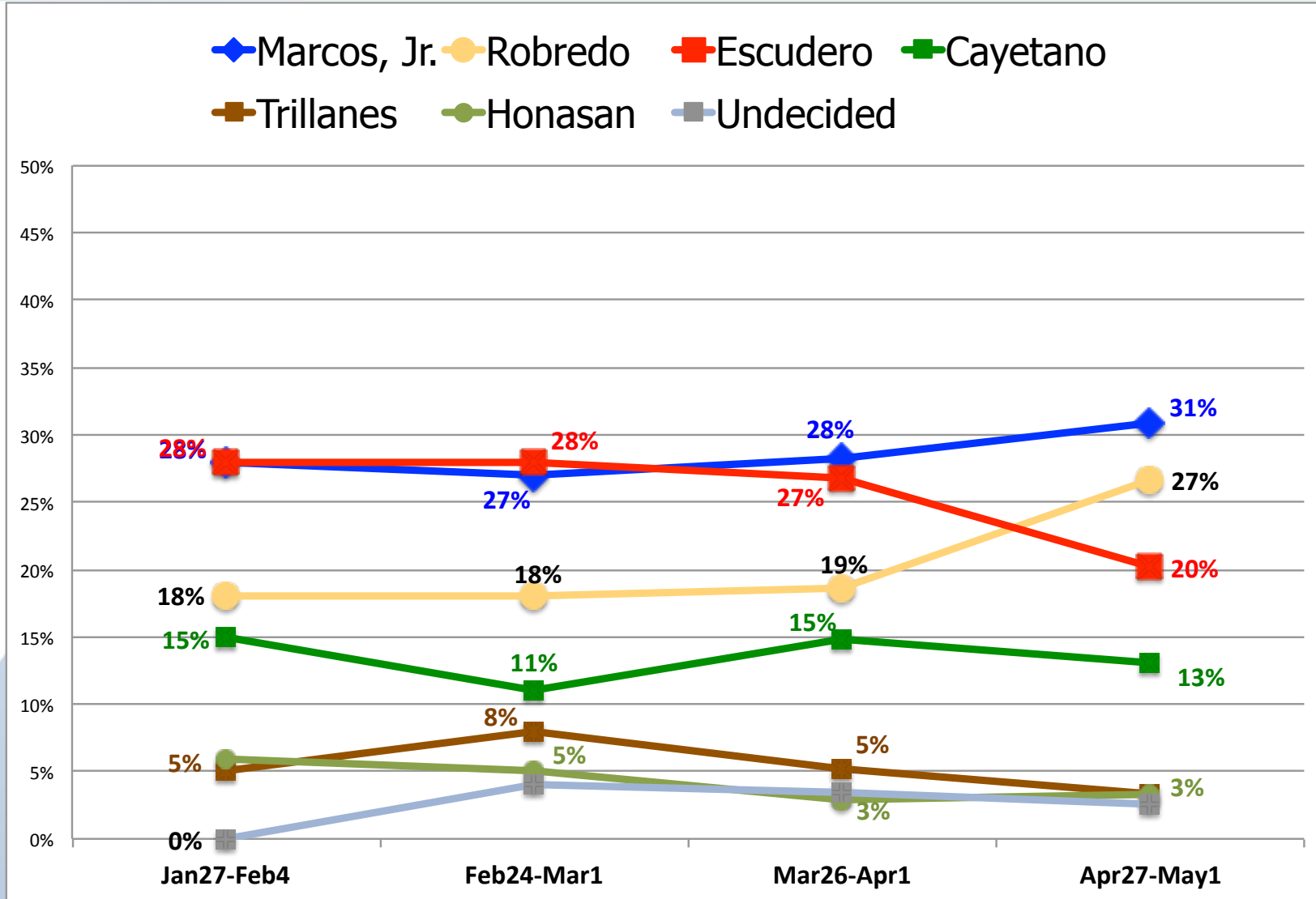

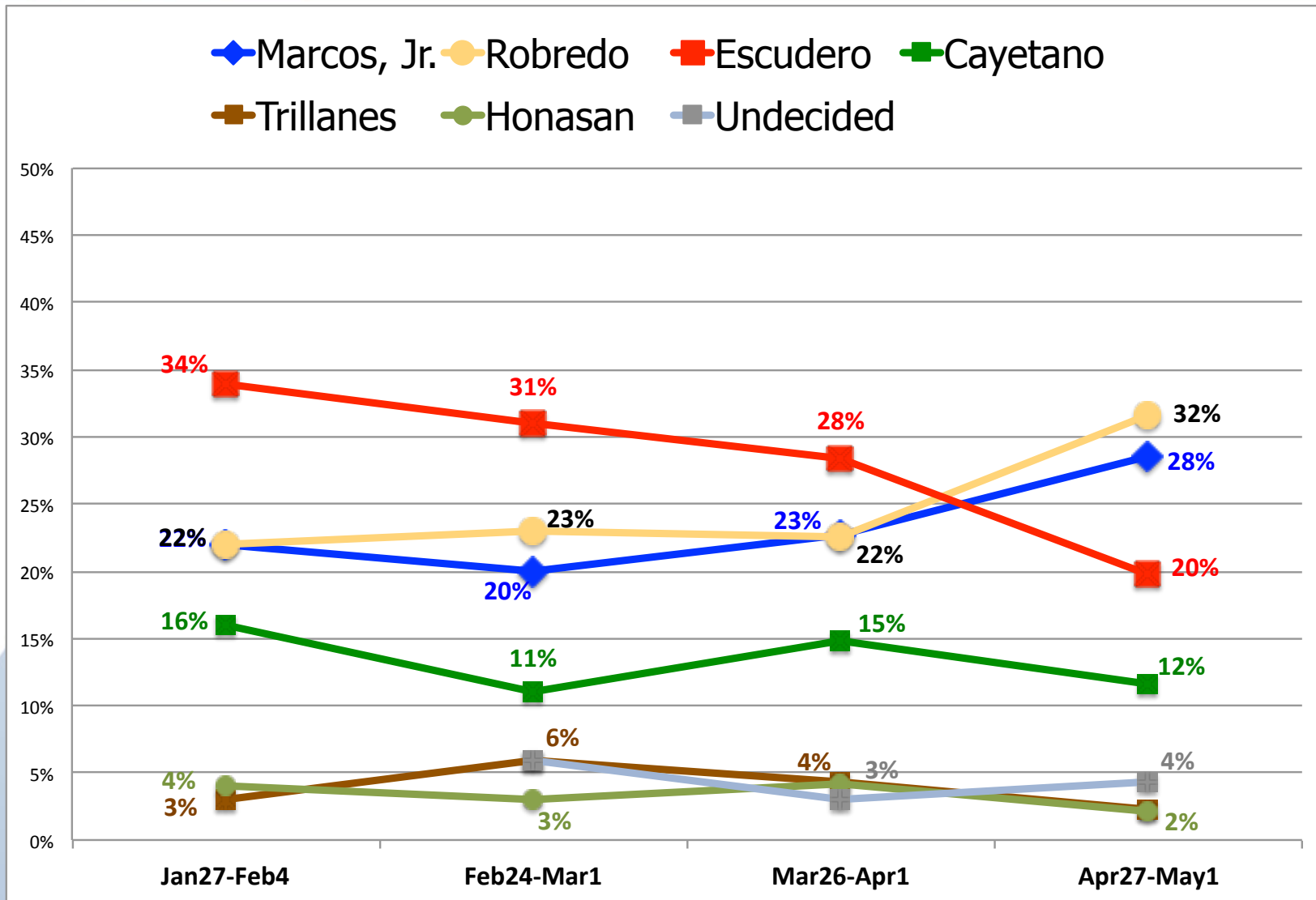

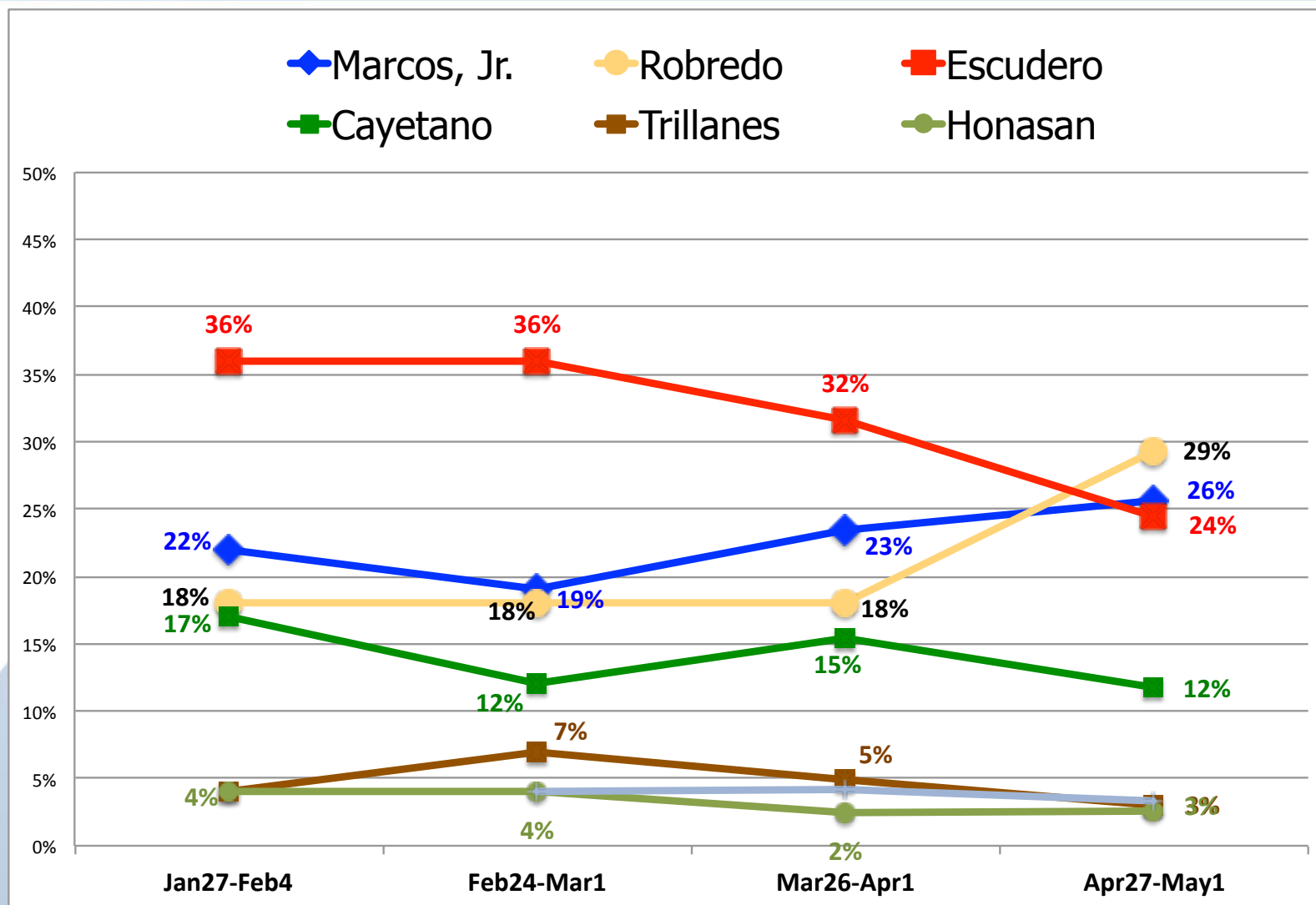

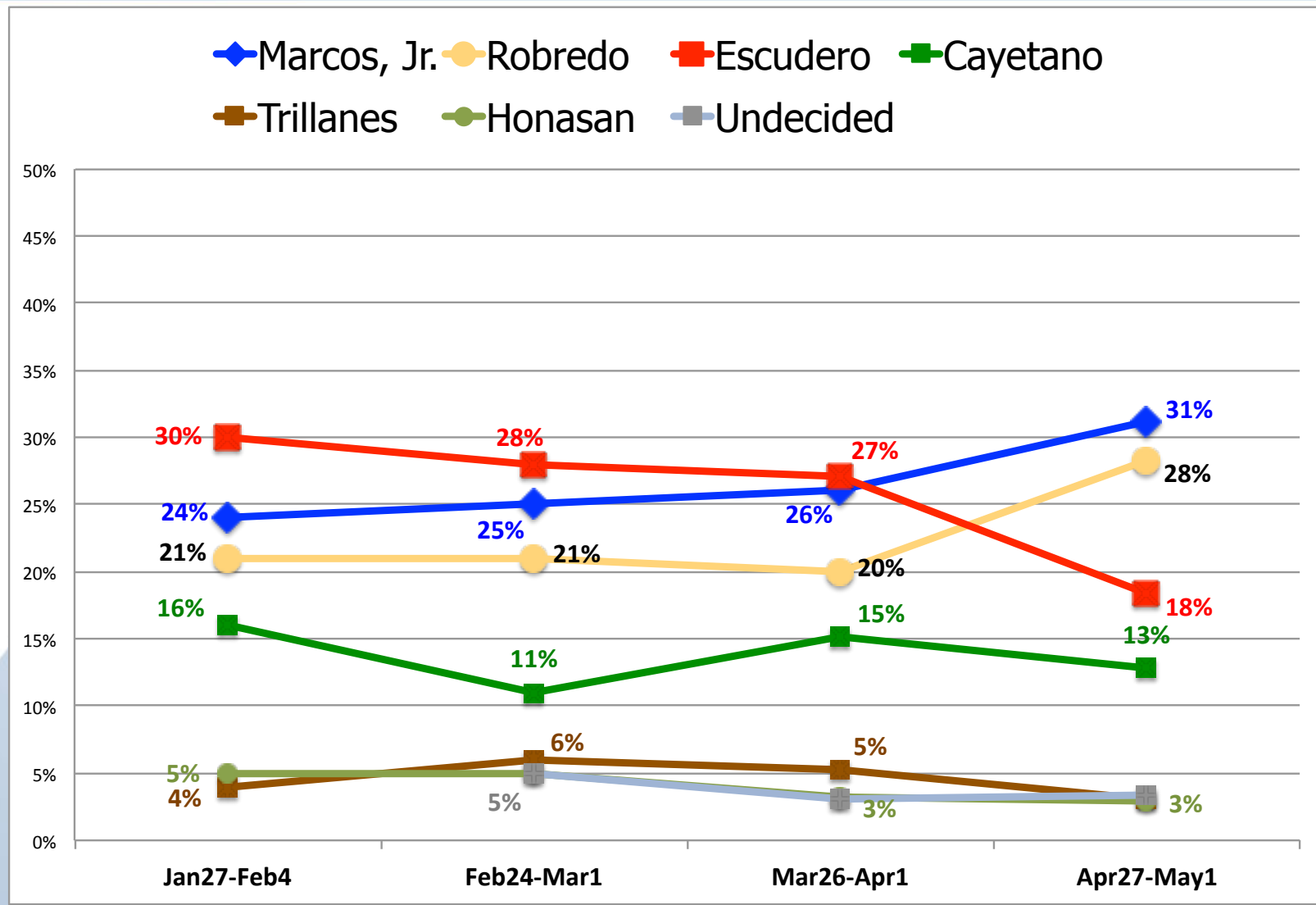

Voter Preference for Vice President: 18-34 years old



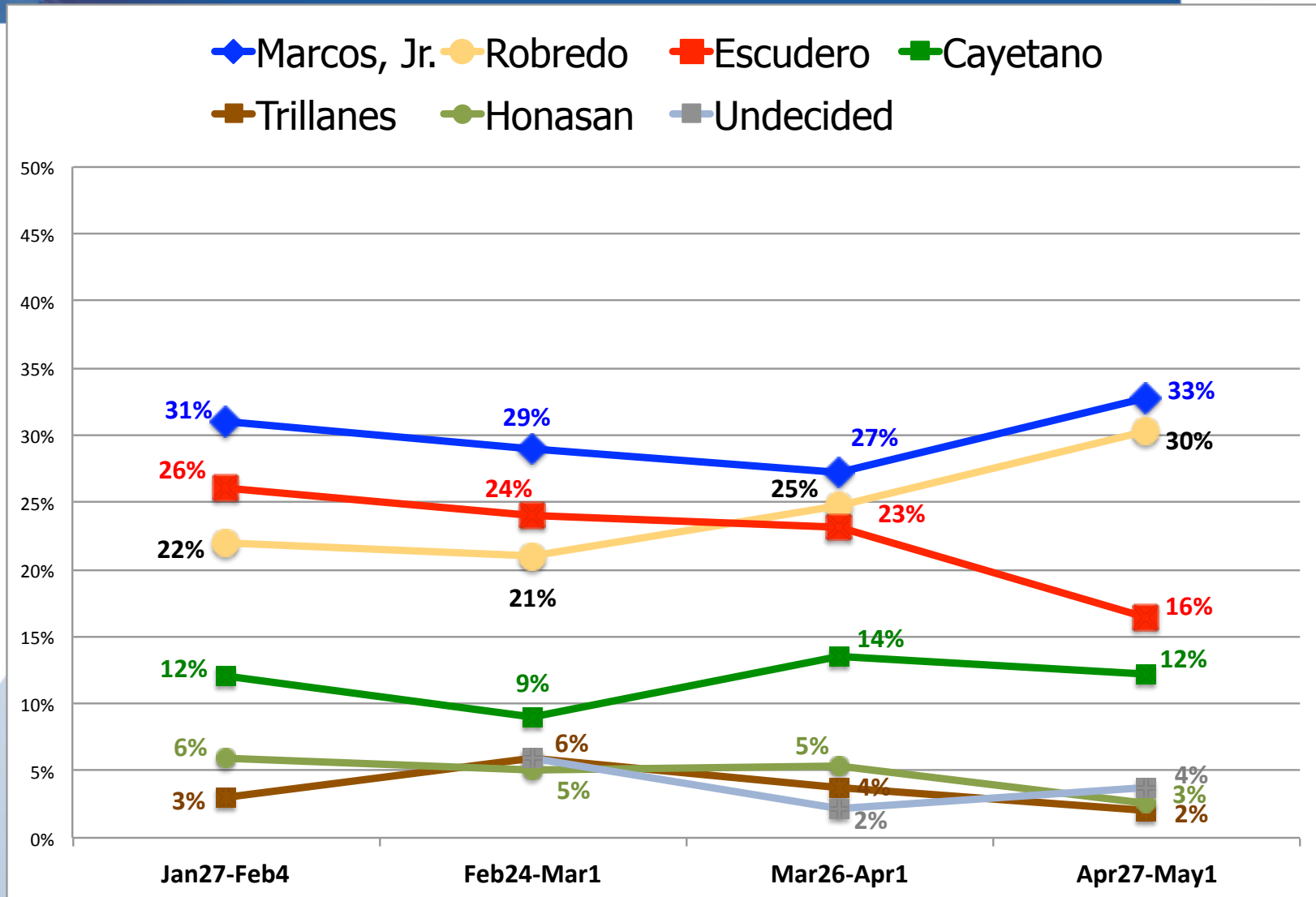

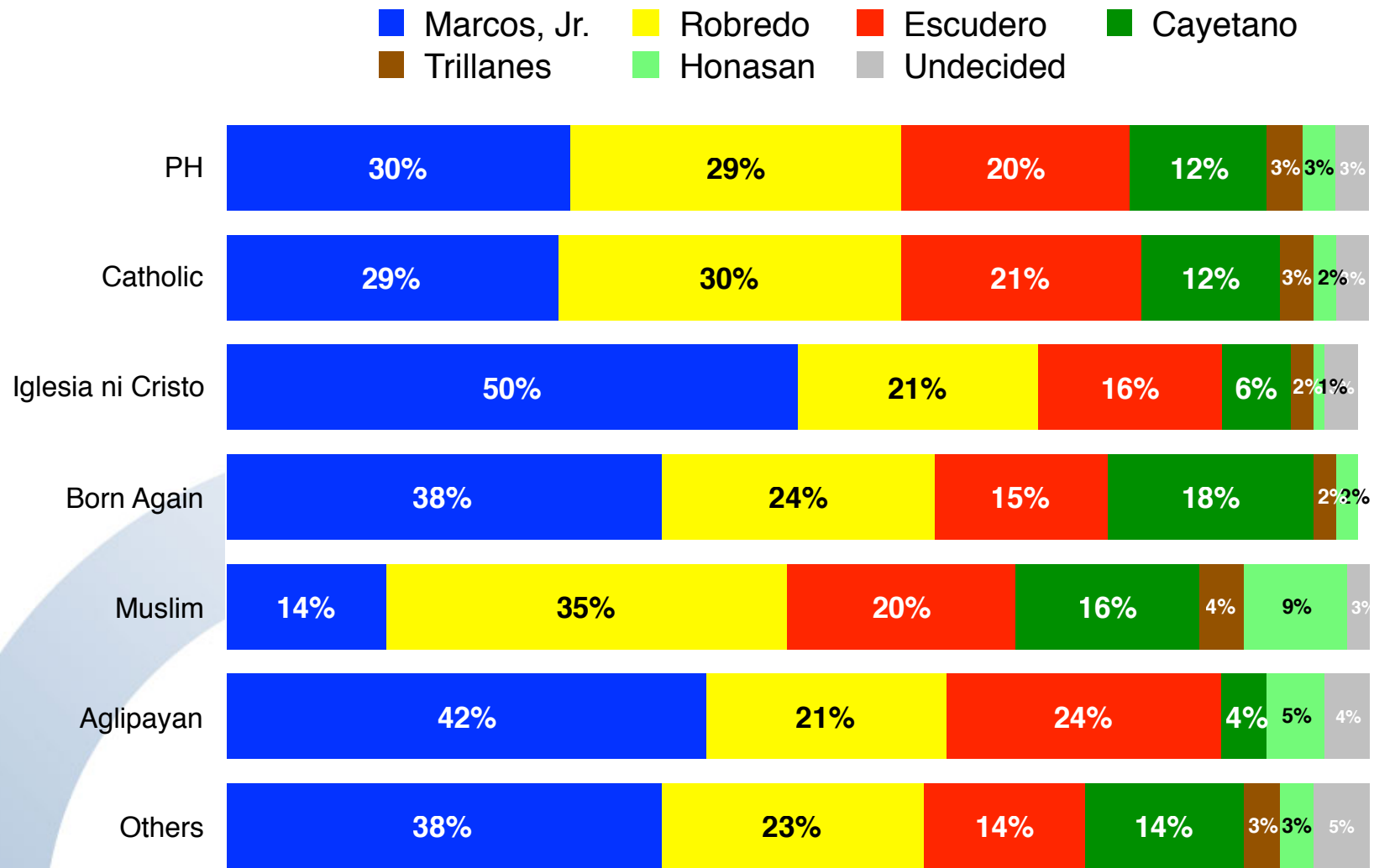

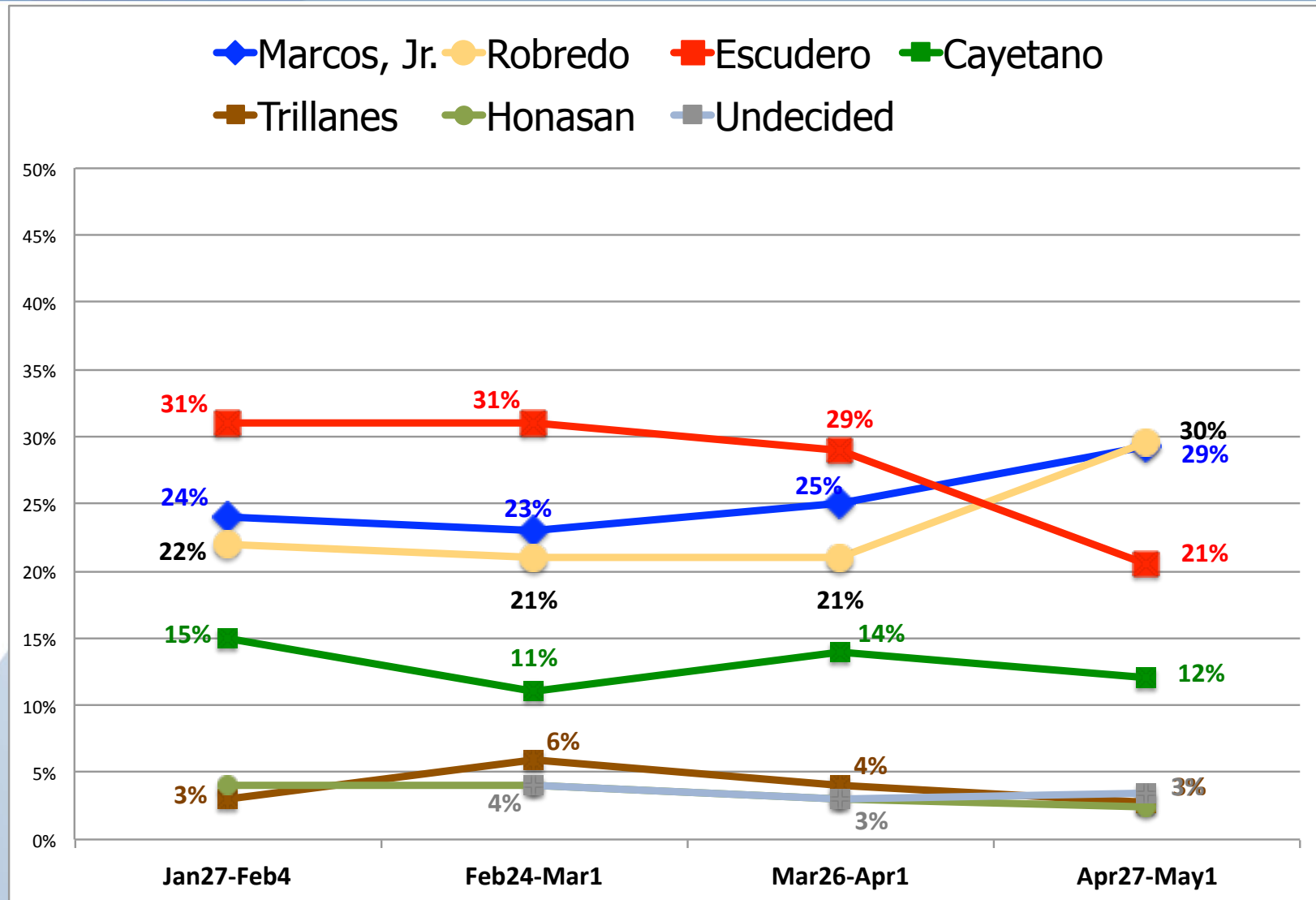

Voter Preference for Vice President by Religious Affiliation



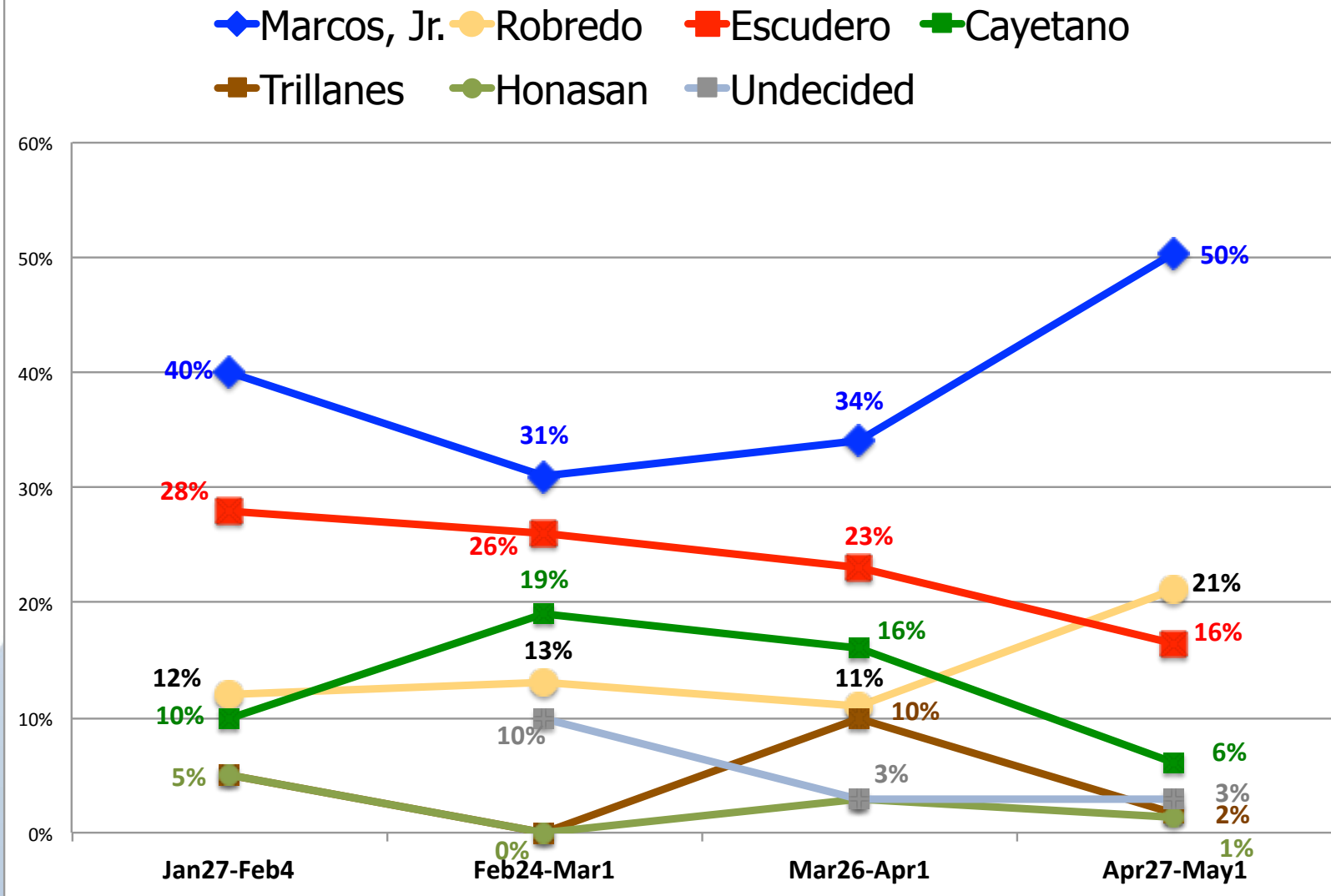

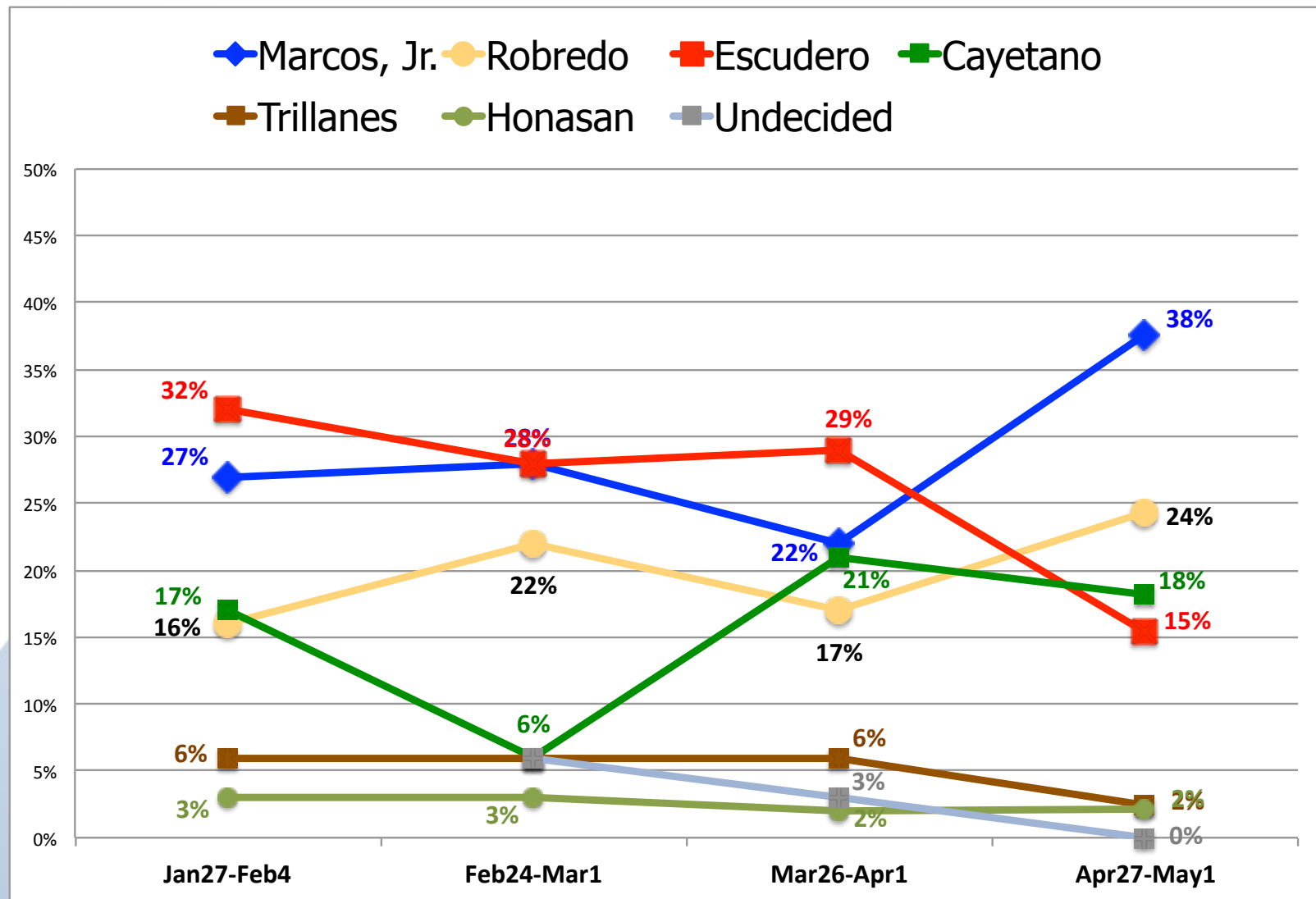

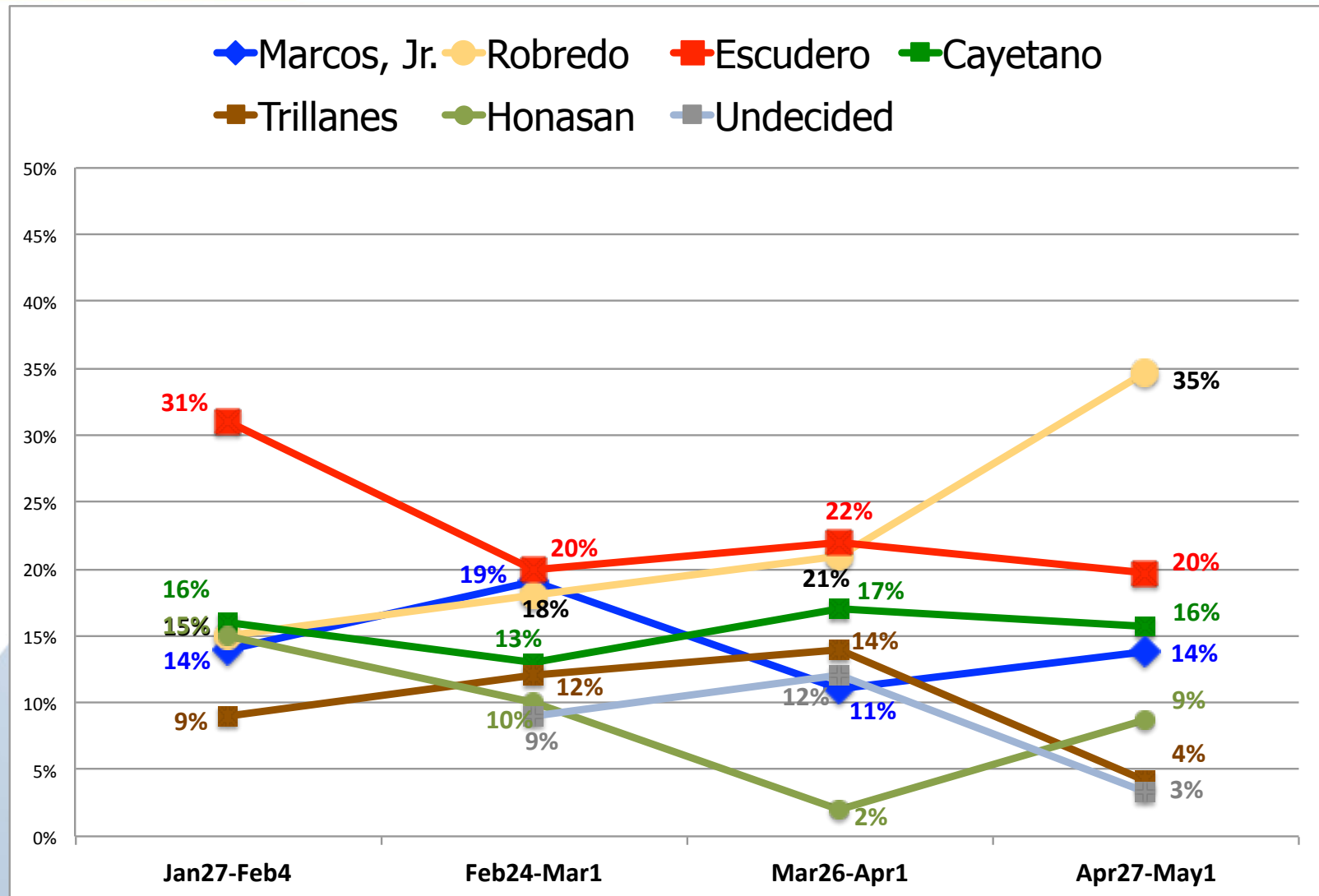

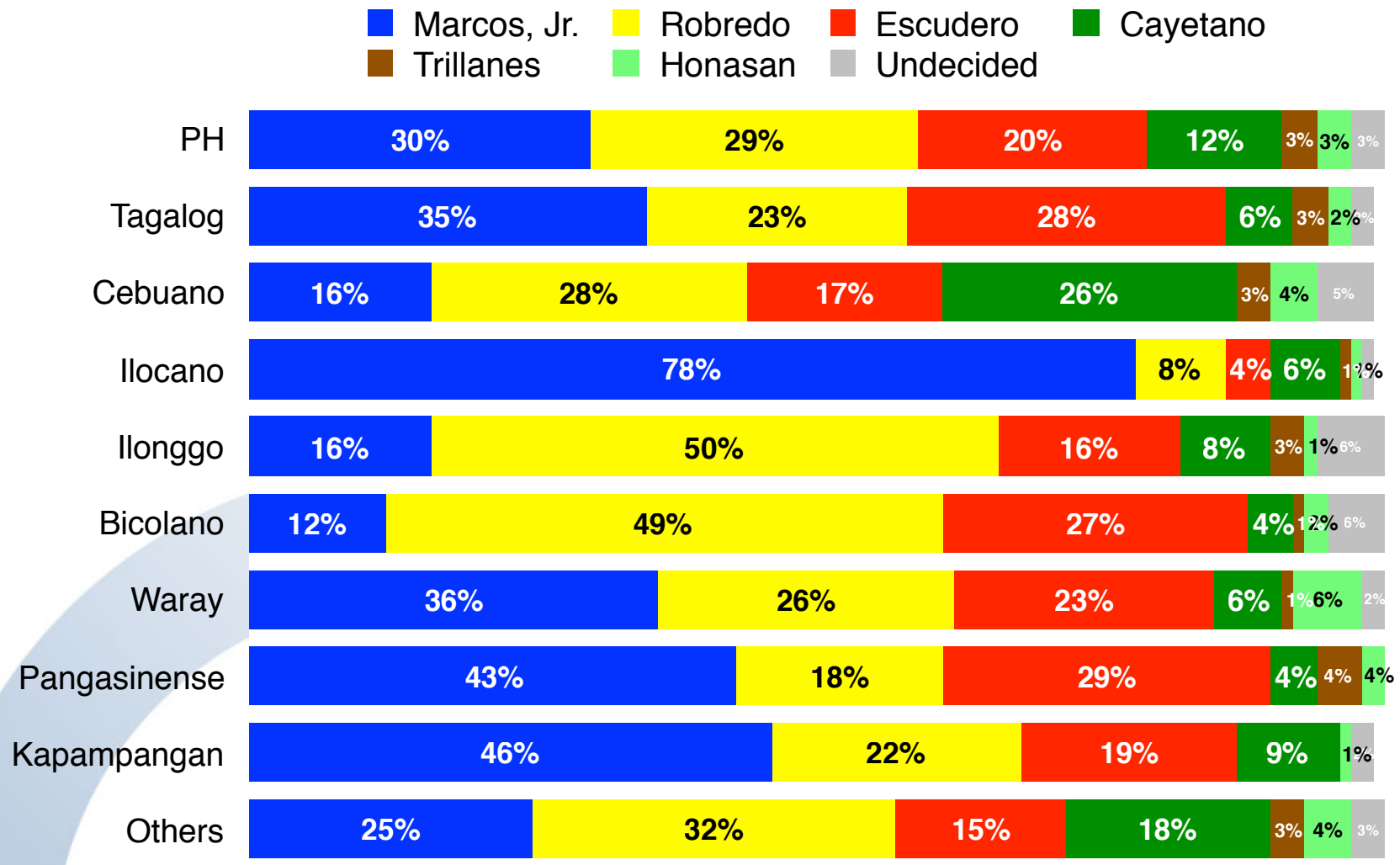

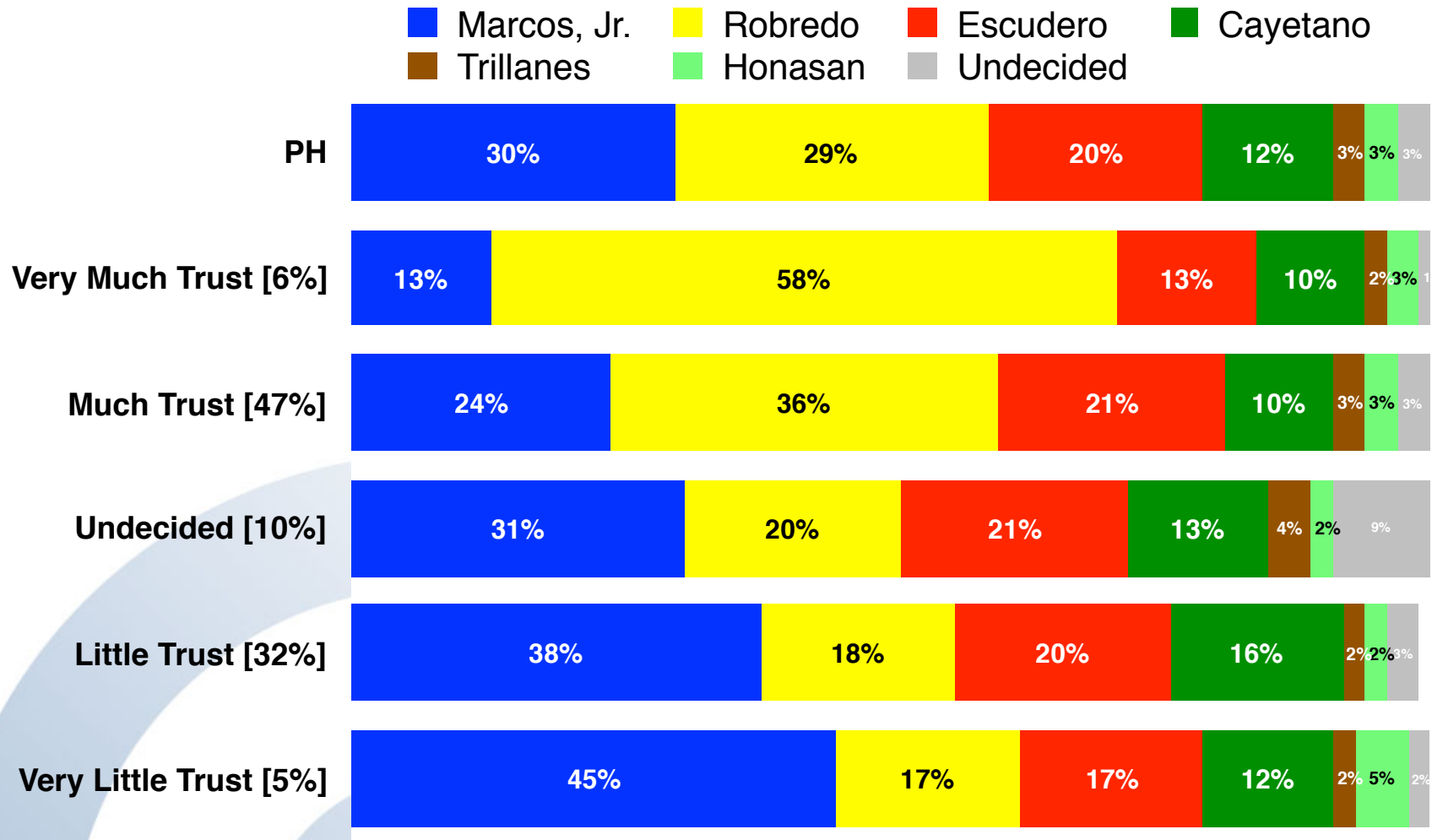
